Rich actually looked in quite good shape despite the long layoff and general good living over the Christmas period, but doubts were expressed over Jeff's condition and likelihood of him being able to keep up with play.

Just for a change, the wind was cold and fierce and Jack lost the toss so we played in to the wind in the first half.

Early play was reasonably even with our five-man midfield quickly closing down the opposition and looking to press forward. However, the midfield was congested and we really needed to get the ball out wide to give us some room to attack down the flanks. As soon as we did this, we scored!

Only three minutes gone and Jay crashed a shot against the bar and **Chay** nipped in at the far post to prod the ball home. Obviously the new boots were working well!

Not too long to wait for the second goal, either. A cracking right foot drive from the right edge of the box from **Jamie**, low in to the far corner of the net. Our third goal was from a cross on the right. **Jamie** leapt, kept his eyes open (*I think*) as he headed the ball in off the post.

Playing against the wind was not proving to be too much of a disadvantage for the midfield and attackers as it held the ball up for our forward runs. Play was not entirely all one-way though, and as Joe under-hit a back pass Nick had to come out smartly to dive and block the shot. At least the pass wasn't as weak as Garry Neville's (and Joe didn't repeat the mistake), and the save was better than Bosnich's feeble effort.

The second half saw us almost camped out in the APR half and we played some neat approach football. With our territorial advantage and the amount of possession we had, we should have doubled our goals tally at least.

As it was, we only added one more goal – somewhat fortuitously. Jamie chased a through ball which was comfortably collected by the 'keeper.

As Jamie walked back, the 'keeper's clearance was miss-controlled by a defender and bobbled back to **Jamie** who capitalised on the error to lift the ball past the 'keeper and in to the net.

**COLTS GO OUT IN DRAMATIC
PENALTY SHOOT-OUT!**

Despite Dave's valiant efforts to get the timing or the day changed, the U14s were committed to fulfilling this fixture on a Sunday afternoon, thus leaving us with only 7 players out of 17 that do not play for other teams on a Sunday.

The Club (as opposed to the manager) entered the U-14 side in this competition and I pointed out to the Committee, prior to the first round, the likely problems that this could cause.

Full marks then to all seven for turning out on, for them, a non-footballing day; also to Jack (who could have been playing for Bitton) and to Dan and Phil who should have been turning out for Fry's U-13 team in an important league encounter.

With eleven players there is no doubt that we would have won. As it was, with Sam Williams ill and having to sit out half the game – and, despite his valiant effort, clearly still unwell when he returned to the fray – we played with virtually 9½ players!

To come back from behind, outplay Backwell for long periods, and cope with extra time on a heavy pitch only to go out the way we did was rough justice. Dave couldn't have asked for any more effort from any of you. I know that all of the parents were really proud of the way you played. It will certainly make team selection for the Hengrove match something of a headache for Dave!

Dave elected for a 3-5-1 formation – a defence full of pace, a solid midfield platform, tricky wingers with a low centre of gravity, and a battering ram up front! I think it fair to say that Ross and Phil were not used to playing so far up the field. Things could be interesting! So, the unlikely, as it may seem, line-up was:

We started brightly, playing with the slope, and Phil flashed a low centre across the face of the goal. Five minutes into the game and Dan and Sam Jones combined at a throw-on to send Phil away again, his cross being met by **Ross** who fired home from close range to open the scoring (0-1). What tactics, what team selection!

Ten minutes gone and Sam Williams, already struggling, played a Backwell attacker on side and he was able to lob Nick as he advanced on him (1-1).

With a quarter of the game gone Ross' pass ricocheted off a defender and although Phil's low drive was pushed out, it was only to the feet of **Chay** who gleefully accepted the chance (1-2).

Lee now moved to defence with Sam Williams moving in to midfield as "nuisance value". Four minutes later and another throw-in on the left, the ball swung in by Dan, and **Chay** was on hand to run in and meet the ball on the half volley, neatly tucking the ball away just inside the near post (1-3).

Chay and Lee then combined well on the right to work the ball out of defence before **Lee's** through ball was only just reached first by the 'keeper to defy Ross and then Chay. Another ball in from Lee and as Sam Williams and Phil both left it for each other to shoot a defender cleared the ball, but only as far as Dan, whose shot shaved the post.

With five minutes of the half remaining we were caught out at the back. A through ball went over the head of Lee and both Sam and Joe dived in to tackles so that when the cross came over the Backwell forward was free to beat Nick from close range (2-3).

HALF TIME: BACKWELL 2 FRY'S 3

The second half kicked off without Sam Williams and with only nine players it only took two minutes for Backwell to equalise. We were caught defending too deeply and an attacker waltzed through to drive the ball low past Nick (3-3).

Dan then set Phil free on a run but instead of chipping the advancing 'keeper he allowed the ball to get too close to him before trying to shoot. Straight away Backwell retaliated with another strike on goal that gave Nick no chance (4-3).

A crazy five minutes and two daft goals conceded because we hadn't listened to instructions. I know it's difficult to change playing habits but we need to be able to switch tactics as the need arises. With only nine players we needed to defend higher up the pitch to deny Backwell space. It also meant that Joe and Sam had room in which to use their pace to recover if a player beat them. Also, we still needed to keep players upfield. This would serve three purposes:

- The ball wouldn't come straight back at us if there was somebody there to challenge, or hold the ball up.
- We were behind, and needed to score to get back in the game.
- We prevent their defence from pushing in to midfield and out-numbering us even more. If we only leave one attacker upfield two defenders may mark him.

Backwell flashed another shot just wide before Phil got in another good cross that nobody could quite get on the end of. Jack then played Chay in, but the 'keeper saved. Dan then burst through on the right, only to shoot in to the side netting.

After our dodgy start to the half we were now looking more composed. Sam and Joe were following our exhortations to move up, and we were endeavouring to step the pace up – a monumental effort for only nine players! Thirteen minutes in to the half and Nick rushed out to try and reach a through ball before a Backwell forward could. Unfortunately, he lost the race and it was a simple task for the attacker to slip the ball home (5-3).

We gained a corner on the left, Dan swung the ball in and as it dropped Phil prodded it a foot wide of the post.

A quarter of the game left and we gained a free kick for a handball offence just inside the Backwell half. Jack dinked the ball over the defence – Dan ran through and rammed the ball home (5-4).

With a quarter of an hour remaining, Sam Williams re-joined the fray – not looking any better, but willing to try. Anyway, it worked! A minute later and Joe, up for a corner, stabbed the ball past the 'keeper (5-5).

We continued to press forward as much as possible. A run by Phil – crowded out; a corner from Jack – cleared; a cross from Phil that evaded Chay by a whisker.

FULL TIME: BACKWELL 5 FRY'S 5

We caught Backwell offside on a couple of occasions as they tried to press forward and we stepped up. A long clearance from Nick allowed Dan to break down the right flank and he was unlucky to see his shot cannon off the bar – our only real chance in the first period of extra time.

Ross was unlucky when his high lob was caught just under the bar by the 'keeper. Dan wriggled his way through several tackles only to screw his shot fractionally wide of the far post. Joe got the ball and launched in to 'Forest' mode – ran half the length of the pitch before appearing to release the ball perfectly for Ross, only for the flag to go up for offside.

AFTER EXTRA TIME: BACKWELL 5 FRY'S 5

Well, what can I say? Fantastic performance: the report doesn't tell the half of it. It doesn't mention:

- the number of tackles and clearances that Sam and Joe made;
- the ground that Lee covered in an effort to play in his and Sam Williams' positions;
- Chay and Phil ploughing tirelessly up and down the flanks;
- Ross battled all game, in an unfamiliar position, often on his own.

- Dan and Jack were, well, awesome is the only word to describe them

So, it came down to penalties. They scored four out of four. They took them well. Even when Nick dived in the right direction he couldn't reach them. We scored three out of five, hit the post twice – bounced out – denied by the width of a fag packet. Who scored and who didn't is immaterial. It's a team game and the team had chances to win during normal time, and as a team we conceded sloppy goals that our performance as a whole didn't merit. Bring on Hengrove; let's see what we can do with a full team!

Early pressure saw our first chance to open the scoring in only the second minute when Ian shot just wide. In the fifth minute a good cross by Jay found Ashley and his miss-hit shot was cleared for a corner, which resulted in the 'keeper saving Jay's header.

Jay then had a one-on-one chance following a through ball from Craig, only to be foiled by the 'keeper. Colin then played Gareth in, but his shot was just wide.

With the half entering its latter stages a good through ball from Ashley to Jay saw the 'keeper get down and hold on to a 50-50 ball.

In the twenty-second minute we were somewhat unlucky to go 1-0 down when Frampton scored from their first real chance of the game, a good shot low in to the corner that gave Sam no chance.

Three minutes later and we lost the ball in midfield, Frampton broke forward and a good ball from their winger saw Frampton go 2-0 up as Sam was beaten in a one-on-one situation.

Following a throw-in in the thirtieth minute Gareth again shot just wide, the last chance of the half.

Frampton broke clear in the first minute and it needed a goal-line clearance from Jason to deny them a third goal.

Jay then ran through and pushed the ball round the 'keeper only to see his shot go less than a foot the wrong side of the post.

Frampton then broke clear again, but Tom made a good intercepting tackle. Their

dangerous winger evaded Jason's lunging tackle and attempted to chip Sam, only for the ball to just clear the bar. We continued to push forward and were rewarded, in the seventeenth minute, when Ian was brought down by the 'keeper. Jay was about to take the penalty when Tom strode up instead. After encroachment by Frampton players the penalty was retaken – Tom duly scored (2-1).

The scene was now set for us to go all out for an equaliser in the final quarter. A throw-in by Jason allowed Colin the chance for a shot, but unfortunately the ball looped over the bar. We continued to pressurise Frampton, and created chances from a corner and a throw-in that we were unable to capitalise upon.
