Gale-force winds make for difficult playing conditions

### **Weekend thoughts....**

Mixed fortunes for our teams this week, both found the windy weather made ball control difficult, and neither match featured particularly flowing football.

In conditions like these we particularly need to maintain shape and pass the ball accurately, and on the ground rather than in the air. Forward balls played in the air will just run away from attacking players when the wind is behind us. When playing against the wind, defensive clearances will lack distance as the ball hangs in the wind and is blown back towards us.

More use of diagonal balls, whether playing with or against the wind, and working the ball out of defence (rather than resorting to aimless punts forward that often see the ball being returned straight away in to the danger area) can help us maintain control. Of course there will be times when safety requires a rushed clearance, but often — with time available — we see just a hopeful long ball played. More communication between players — shouts of "time", or "man on" can help. Too often there is too much chatter in pre-match and halftime tactics talks and none at all during the game!

We won the toss and elected to kick with the wind – the theory being to build a lead and then defend it. Jack Belsher was only fractionally wide with an effort from an early corner, but Whitchurch defended stoutly thereafter and not too many chances were created.

The fact that conditions were going to be difficult was illustrated in only the third minute when the Whitchurch 'keeper, kicking from hand, saw the ball blown back over his head and straight out for a corner!

However, although we were to have plenty of the play in the first half and forced several corners we didn't adopt the 'shoot on sight' policy that might have paid more dividends.

Although a shot from Dan squeezed through the defence, it lacked power. It wasn't until a quarter of an hour had gone that a long ball from Joe was well controlled by Zolly, on the halfway line, and his through ball gave Jamie the opportunity to run on and, from the edge of the penalty area, hit a shot only a yard wide.

With twenty minutes gone Whitchurch broke quickly and Tom was beaten for pace out on the left, Joe's challenge was shrugged off as the ball came over, and Greg had no chance with the shot over him and in to the net (0-1).

Dan was then just off target with a header from another corner, and Jack Belsher got in a shot after the ball had skewed off a defender's foot, only for it to be well saved by the 'keeper.

With half an hour gone another corner to us saw the ball headed half clear by a defender, only for the ball to drop to **Jack** B who drove low in to the corner of the net (1-1).

Whitchurch were straight back on the attack and for once Sam was outpaced on the left and although Greg spread himself and saved well with his legs, the ball rebounded around our area, we were unable to clear, and the ball was lashed home (1-2).

Phil came off with an injured ankle and Jason came on to play behind the front two, Zolly switching out wide.

Dan came off at half time, struggling with a thigh strain, and Ross went on for the second half, and later, with a quarter of an hour remaining, Chay was to come on in place of Zolly.

A push in the back on Jamie gave us the chance to equalise from the penalty spot, but Jason's kick was hit weakly at the 'keeper.

Other than this sortie into Whitchurch's half we spent most of the second half penned back in our own half. Whilst Tom, Joe, and Sam all made telling contributions in terms of tackles and interceptions there were again times when our defensive shape was found wanting and large gaps appeared. Greg made several good saves as Whitchurch launched wave after wave of attacks, one shot crashed back off the bar and the follow up shot was screwed wide.

A penalty conceded by Joe was converted and two other chances accepted as Whitchurch, who had overall played the more controlled football ran out deserved winners. At least there was no capitulation (see Rich for explanation) as there had been against Patchway, although overall it had been a disappointing performance. Jack Gooding was 'Man of the Match', well done Jack.

Yesterday's gale was still blowing and we elected to kick against the wind in the first half, today's theory being that if we started to tire in the second half then we'd be able to clear the ball easier.

As expected, Eastwood did the early pressing and Sam showed confident handling in the first minute, comfortably holding a head high shot.

We responded with a flowing move, started by Liam on the right, inside to Colin, left to Phil, and on to Ashley before the ball was played in to the area for Jay to get in a shot that, in turn, was comfortably saved by their 'keeper.

A 'foot up' by Colin gave Eastwood a free kick, struck just wide from 30 yards. Eastwood took the lead in the eighth minute when an unfortunate bounce took the ball away from Jason and in to the path of an Eastwood attacker. His shot rebounded off the post, and with Sam grounded an Eastwood forward nipped in to poke the ball over the line (0-1).

Eastwood then managed to gain a couple of corners, one held by Sam under the bar, the other in to the side netting. Then, in the eighteenth minute an Eastwood player, forty

yards out, surprised us with a pot shot that flew over Sam and in to the net (0-2).

Whilst given the conditions this was by no means a calamitous occurrence it would obviously prevent Eastwood's confidence from growing if we could prevent them adding to their tally. With the midfield tackling strongly and the back four relatively in control — the odd miss kick not withstanding — and Sam watchful, this was duly accomplished. If we could only get a goal back then this could deflate Eastwood.

Given that it was not until twenty minutes in to the half before we got our second chance – Jay's strong run taking him through and his shot past the advancing 'keeper was only just wide of the post – this might be optimistic!

However, with ten minutes of the half remaining, **Jay** again burst through and this time crashed his shot low in to the net (1-2).

#### HALF TIME: FRY'S 1 EASTWOOD 2

Mark came on at right back and Nick switched to the right wing in place of Liam, whilst lan replaced Ashley on the left. Three minutes in to the half and we were level. A corner on the right saw Craig's cross met by Jay and his header cleared off the line. The ball was played back out to **Craig** who crashed his shot in from a narrow angle (2-2).

A quick throw-in by Mark, over the top of the defence allowed Gareth to get in a shot, that just cleared the bar. The lead was not long in coming, however, as in the fifth minute **Jay** unleashed a shot from the edge of the area. Although the 'keeper got both hands to the ball the power of the shot took it through his grasp (3-2).

A long throw from Jason nearly allowed Ian a shot at goal, but he was crowded out. Another cross in from Nick was headed over by Jay and Gareth again was just off target when Mark headed the ball through to him. Twenty minutes gone and a measured shot from Colin was well held by the 'keeper, but he had no chance two minutes later when Jay really leathered a shot from way out on the left that flew over his head and in to the net (4-2).

In to the last quarter of an hour and a rare incursion in to our half saw Sam collect the ball and his long clearance was knocked on

by Jay. Gareth hared after the ball and was always going to be second to the ball in his race with a defender. However, as the defender tried to shepherd the ball out for a goal kick Gareth's tenacity paid off as he won the ball in a tackle and crossed from the byline to give Jay a simple tap in (5-2). Dan, sidelined with a thigh strain, but itching to get in to the action came on in midfield for the last ten minutes. Jay came off and Mark moved up to centre forward — had Dave bribed the manager in an effort to get Mark's name on the scoresheet before Phil? The battle was on to see who would be the last outfield player in the team to score!

With half an hour gone, Nick did well to win a corner on the right. He followed this up with a flick-on at the near post from Craig's cross and as the ball dropped to the far post **Phil** stooped to head the ball over the line (6-2).

A minute later and Dan backheaded a long throw from Mark and lan reacted quickly to reach the ball first and slide the ball past the 'keeper from the narrowest of angles (7-2).

Gareth then tried unsuccessfully to power his way through a melee of defenders, but **Dan** waded in and used his greater weight to good effect, bursting through and knocking his shot in off the post (8-2).

Injury time saw us trying to get the ball to Mark to give him the opportunity to open his account for the season, but he was crowded out on a couple of occasions. My money's on him to score next week!
