Avon initiated the first attack, but the ball was well shepherded out by Joe. We retaliated with a good through ball for Dan to cross, but the ball was plucked out of the air by the 'keeper. Jay burst through and collided with a defender and the 'keeper. They all went down, but all got up OK and from the resultant corner

Colin put in a good cross that Jay headed downwards only for the ball to be cleared off the line.

Five minutes gone and an Avon corner from our left was well met at the far post – Phil managed to get in a block and we cleared the danger.

A long goal kick from Tom and Dan helped the ball on to Jay who rifled a shot just wide of the far post from 30 yards.

Avon took the lead after a quarter of an hour when they were again first to the ball from a corner and the ball dropped for a defender to prod the ball past Liam and the unsuspecting Phil (0-1).

A crossfield ball from Dan gave Mark a shooting opportunity from outside the area that the 'keeper was able to get down and hold, and two minutes later another shot from Mark was hit over the bar. We were doing most of the pressing, but Avon were quick to counter attack when the opportunity presented itself.

A long clearance from Tom found Dan, who tried to work himself in to a shooting position, but he was crowded out and his effort was blocked. The ball fell to Nick and his shot was deflected for a corner. This was cleared from the near post and it required good covering play by Jason to thwart the resulting Avon attack.

Just over twenty minutes gone and a crunching tackle on Dan saw him require treatment. Tom took the free kick and the shot cleared the wall and looked to be curling in to the top corner, only to pass just over the bar. Joe too soon required treatment for an elbow in the face, but he too recovered. We continued to press forward but couldn't manage to penetrate Avon's well-organised defence.

A long throw-in by Jason and flick on by Jay to Colin ended with Dan winning a corner. Colin's kick was put out for another corner, this time taken by Dan; again the cross was headed clear by Avon.

Another corner saw Colin first in with a header, but he was unable to direct it on target. Another quick break by Avon saw Jason forced to concede a corner, won this time by Tom and cleared by Dan. Liam then did well to shepherd an attacker in to the corner and prevent him crossing, only to have a corner awarded

against him. Dan rose to head clear. Avon were pressing forward more now, but a long clearance from Tom found Jay who won a corner which he took himself, but straight in to the hands of the 'keeper.

HALF TIME: ATHLETIC 1 COLTS 0

For the second half Curtis replaced Nick up front and we started brightly with a fine run by Joe, down the right flank and a good ball on to Dan who centred, but Jay was just unable to reach the cross. Mark had another shot on target but again the 'keeper was equal to it. Ten minutes in to the half and Gareth came off to be replaced by Ian.

With a quarter of an hour gone Craig came on to replace Liam and we switched to a 3 - 4 - 3 formation. A corner on the left saw Craig's centre met by Curtis, but his shot blocked.

Our best chance probably came after twenty minutes when a ball in by Dan from the right found Jay momentarily unmarked. He took a mighty swing at the ball but failed to connect.

A well struck through ball from Craig saw Curtis just beaten to the ball by the 'keeper, and then good play from Joe on the right enabled Dan to get the ball in to Curtis, who won a corner. Craig's centre saw the ball bobble around on the edge of the six-yard box with Tom and Ian both attempting to get shots in before the ball eventually found its way in to the hands of the 'keeper.

With half an hour gone, Jay chased a long through ball that the 'keeper got to first, only to then be flattened by Jay. The 'keeper needed to receive lengthy treatment before, fortunately, being fit to continue. The referee gave Jay a strong lecture but, with some of the spectators baying for Jay to be sent off, deemed that there had been no intent to the collision.

Jason set off on a storming run down the left, beating four players with his pace and strength before he ran out of room. Dan was chopped down and Craig's free kick just wouldn't drop for one of our players, the ball being forced out for a corner. Avon cleared and broke quickly down our left flank, only for Jason to again get in a good interception. Dan was penalised for a foul and received a talking-to, again spectators demanding action in terms of - at least - a booking.

Play continued with us desperately searching for an equaliser, but Avon holding out.

Still, we made a good start to the game when, in the third minute, a nice flick on from Craig saw **Jay** run on and slide the ball effortlessly past the 'keeper to open the scoring (1-0).

Play was fairly even between the teams for the next few minutes. Brislington were looking to pass the ball

round and our midfield were snapping at them and not giving them time to settle on the ball. We were looking to get the ball out wide if possible, but moving it quicker. However, both defences seemed to be in control.

In the twelfth minute a good break from Brislington saw them get bodies in our area and us struggle to clear the ball before Jason managed to hack it away. In fairness, the swirling wind was not making play easy.

We responded with a shot from Gareth that was over the bar. Then Bris attacked down our left flank and whipped in a cross for a forward to get in a shot that Joe did well to get across to block, the ball ballooning over the bar. The near post corner was headed out by Jason.

Another good through ball from Craig, helped on by Jay, to Ian saw him crowded out on the edge of the area. The ball came back to Jay whose shot on the turn went wide.

With 25 minutes gone Tom was penalised for the third time for using his arm to hold his opponent down when jumping for a header. The free kick was quickly taken, Mark missed his kick, Jason intercepted the pass but only to set up a Bris forward with an easy chance to beat Phil with a rising shot from six yards (1-1).

Five minutes later and Bris attacked down our right flank and it took a block by Phil and a good tackle by Mark to prevent Bris taking the lead.

Colin pumped a long ball forward that was fumbled by the 'keeper under pressure from Craig, and a corner conceded, but comfortably cleared. In to the final minute of the half and a good crossfield ball from Nick saw Gareth peel off from his marker and from 25 yards lob the 'keeper – the ball just dipping over the 'keeper and in to the top corner. That was the last kick of the half.

HALF TIME: COLTS 2 BRISLINGTON 1

Dan came on at half time in place of Ian and almost increased our lead straight away. A foul on Mark saw Tom hit a good free kick deep in to the area and for the 'keeper to hold Dan's header, just under the bar.

Gareth then had another shot over the bar before a foul on Craig and cross from Tom gave Mark a chance as the 'keeper came out and just managed to get a touch on the ball sufficient to nudge it round the post. Craig's corner was a good one, right under the crossbar, but Bris managed to clear it.

As Bris mounted an attack Mark made a good tackle and played the ball forward for Jay to set Dan free on a run, only for him to be brought up by the referee for jumping in to a tackle with both feet.

We were then treated to the unusual sight – according to Andy – of Nick heading the ball, surreptitiously rearranging his hair afterwards!

Twelve minutes in to the half and Brislington were allowed to equalise. Our defence stood off and watched as an attacker waltzed through, and although Phil got a hand to the shot the ball rebounded for another forward to slot home (2-2).

Three minutes later and another free kick from Tom following a foul on Mark, and Dan got the ball from a defender's header. He managed to get the ball out to Jay on the left edge of the penalty area and he wormed his way in to the area to drive the ball between 'keeper and near post (3-2).

Phil was penalised for travelling with the ball outside the penalty area, the indirect free kick tapped to one side for a shot that was wide.

A long throw from Jay saw Dan head a foot wide of the post Bris came back at us and forced a corner. Nick headed clear from the near post. Nobody attacked the loose ball, however and a Bris forward was allowed a free shot at goal. Fortunately the ball passed harmlessly over the bar.

Into the last five minutes and Andy issued instructions to Dan "Brains" Payne to keep the ball and head for the corner when he received it. Dan's retort was "We want to go for the win, don't we?" On being told we were winning 3-2 his response was "Oh, are we!" Anyway, instructions were duly heeded and the result at the final whistle was:

Fishponds kicked off, immediately lost the ball, and John received the clearance and passed out to Jay on the left. The cross came in and **John** had made ground for the return ball to tuck it under the advancing 'keeper (1-0).

From the kick-off Fishponds immediately lost the ball again, Zolly played the ball in for John to lay it off for Dan. Customary lack of flair and blistering pace was again his downfall as he was muscled off the ball, albeit at the expense of a corner.

With the wind behind his kick Jay's corner came across like a bullet, glanced off the top of Dan's head and went out of play, almost at the corner flag, for a goalkick. The kick was poor, straight at John, and although his shot was blocked by the 'keeper a defender made a hash of the attempted clearance and **Dan** was on hand to poke the ball home from six yards (2-0), and only three minutes gone.

Four minutes gone and Rich played the ball in for John to have another shot, again saved. Having now gone three minutes without scoring, Dave began to get desperate and shouted for Jack to "Get it wide and stop poncing around in the middle."

A rare Fishponds attack saw a player skip past Tom and Sam, but Rich got in a good covering tackle. Back on the attack and an exchange of balls between Jay and John saw the ball arrive at the feet of Dan who managed to get it stuck between his feet with the 'keeper well out of position and the chance was lost.

Ten minutes gone and a poor goalkick straight to **John** saw him take the ball forward before cracking it through the 'keeper's hands and in to the back of the net (3-0).

Two minutes later and Sam played the ball out to Jack, on to Zolly, and a cross in for **John** to lose his marker and crash the ball in to the back of the net to clinch his hat-trick (4-0).

Another break by Fishponds saw Nick out nearly to the edge of his area but the attempt to chip him sailed wide.

With a quarter of an hour gone **Dan** got his second as Jay's persistence won the ball and his low cross was rammed home (5-0). Two minutes later and a poor kick out from Nick put himself in trouble but he recovered well to claim the ball in the tackle and pounce on it.

A right wing cross from Zolly to John and set up for **Rich** to shoot left-footed - the ball again squirming through the 'keeper's hands (6-0).

After 20 minutes a good tackle by Joe and a through ball from Lee to **Dan** saw him tuck the ball under the 'keeper, just when he looked to have over-run it (7-0).

A corner on the right from Jay was met by a clever little back-heel from **John** at the near post, in to the back of the net (8-0). This was followed by an excellent bit of by-play between Tom and Zolly on the right. Tom advanced purposefully in to the area only to pull his low shot just wide of the far post.

With 23 minutes gone **Jack** got on the score sheet with a left foot shot, previous efforts with the right being off target (9-0).

Jay won the ball on the left, played the ball in to John crossed for a defender to again fail to clear and **Zolly** to bundle the ball home (10-0).

Almost half an hour gone and a little showboating on the right from Zolly and Jack ended with Zolly playing the ball back for **Jack** to line up a shot from twenty-five yards and crash the ball over the 'keeper and under the bar (11-0).

A minute later and the same combination exchanged passes down the right before **Zolly** came in from the right, along the goal line, rounded the 'keeper and nonchalantly side-footed the ball home (12-0).

With 32 minutes gone Fishponds won a corner. Although we cleared the ball it came back in to the area and Nick, suffering from cramp, frostbite, wind chill, etc. was fooled by the bounce of the ball and a Fishponds player was able to knock the ball past his despairing dive (12-1).

A shot from Jack came back off the post only for **Dan** to knock the ball home (13-1). This heralded the start of what was to be frequent tinkering with our formation as Dave - reasonably safe in the assumption that the game was beyond Fishponds' ability to claw their way back - adopted a cavalier attitude. Sam went up front and Dan dropped in to the back three.

Fishponds took the opportunity to switch keepers, their centre half going in goal. He was in action straight away, saving with his feet from an effort by Zolly. Unfortunately for him the ball came out to **John** and that was number 14!

A foul on Lee right on the edge of the box saw Rich curl the free kick just wide before a deep cross from Jay fooled the 'keeper and **Sam** managed to knock the ball in from close range (15-1). Sam now dropped back in to defence and Joe switched to centre forward. Little did we know at this stage what joy this was to bring to the afternoon!

Zolly pulled the ball back for Jay to have a shot, but it lacked his customary power and was straight at the 'keeper, before Joe found himself in acres of space and calmly fired home. Unfortunately he was the only player not to have heard the whistle go for him being offside.

At half time Dave brought off Nick, Zolly, and John, and put Dan in goal. So, the scorers of 11 of our goals wouldn't get the opportunity of increasing their tally.

Could we continue to knock in goals in the second half? Nick was given the option of staying on as an outfield player, but elected to try and get warm by wearing a coat rather than running about; Ross and Chay were now at the cutting edge of our attack.

Dave said he'd send Phil on after a few minutes of the second half, once he saw how things had settled down. He then realised as the second half was about to kick off that he had taken off three players but only sent on two substitutes, so play was delayed while Phil struggled to get his tracksuit top off!

Well two tame shots from Joe and Jay in the first two minutes before Phil sent Jay down the line, the cross was met by Ross and his shot parried. Joe slid the ball in to the net but was – offside.

Three minutes gone and a pass from Jack out to Rich, now playing wide on the right, and a cross in that **Ross** deftly glided past the 'keeper (16-1). Two minutes later and a well weighted through ball from Lee was nicely in to the path of Jay who again shot straight at the 'keeper. Joe then volleyed the ball home, a lovely shot, only for the flag to go up against Ross. So, a hat-trick of offside goals for Joe! This was, of course, met with hoots of merriment from the rest of Fry's players.

Seven minutes gone and a cross in from Jay on the left took out the 'keeper and **Chay** had a simple tap-in (17-1). Then a deep cross by Phil, on an overlap, found Rich who laid the ball back for **Ross** to crash a shot against the 'keeper's legs and then netting the rebound (18-1).

Two minutes later and Jeff, fed up with flagging for offside almost every time Fishponds attacked decided to let play continue and see what Dan could do in goal. The answer was – nothing. The forward beat him easily (18-2). A quarter of an hour gone and **Jay** at last got his name on the score sheet with a shot from inside the area (19-2), before Chay rolled the ball in to the path of **Jack** who side-footed it past the 'keeper (20-2).

Jack now dropped in to the right back slot and Tom moved up front to link up with Joe and Ross – surely a forward line to strike fear in to the hearts of the opposition. Sure enough, Joe latched on to the ball, calmly beat one player, calmly side-stepped a second and – calmly shot tamely at the 'keeper!

Ross then scooped a shot wide before Phil – to quote him – “skinned three players inside the box and was brought down for an obvious penalty when I was bound to score”. Unfortunately for Phil the referee showed some compassion for Fishponds and waved play on.

With a quarter of an hour gone. Fishponds adopted an interesting change of tactics, and decided to play with five forwards against our, by now, two defenders.

Lee and Chay now combined to put Joe through but his shot was hopelessly wide. Opinion on the line was that there was more chance of Elvis turning up to watch the rest of the game than Joe scoring so he was relegated to the left back berth and Phil went up front.

Nearly half an hour gone and **Chay** neatly tucked the ball home from ten yards (21-2).

Then, as a Fishponds player ran through our defence and bore down on goal a pathetic attempt by Dan to win the ball saw him trip the Fishpond player and concede an obvious penalty.

Now, to digress a little. I have often made the point that pace can be combated by anticipation – the switched-on player can gain a yard or two before a slower thinking player can move. Thinking about Newton's third law of motion – that every action has an equal and opposite reaction – or something like that, the reverse must also hold true. So, when the penalty was hit weakly, straight at him, Dan's reactions were so slow that he hadn't had time to make up his mind which way to dive. Even then he only just managed to keep the ball from trickling through his legs.

Five minutes remaining and a nice ball in from Chay allowed **Phil** time to pick his spot and place the ball past the 'keeper (22-2). A minute later and **Jay** rolled another one in (23-2).

Lee now moved forward with Jay dropping back in to the centre and he was unlucky to have a well-struck shot ruled out for offside. Fishponds now elected to change their 'keeper again!

In to stoppage time and Ross put Lee through, his shot was saved but the 'keeper couldn't hold the ball and **Phil** had a simple tap-in (24-2). Phil was looking to get number 25 when, clear of the defence and in a one-on-one with the 'keeper, the referee decided that enough was enough and brought play to a close.
