With Rich carrying a leg injury, and Jay out, Dave toyed with the idea of reverting to 4-4-2. Jack used his influence as captain to dissuade our manager – something to do with Jack and Dan having to do too much running around when there are only four in midfield. So, Mark came in to provide the midfield graft to support the silky passing skills of Dan and Jack (should the word alleged be in here somewhere?).

Sam came back in at the back and Phil was to be our secret weapon wide on the left. Actually, Phil thought he had to play as a winger until I pointed out he lacked both speed and trickery – the two attributes most commonly associated with wingers. As a secret weapon the ploy was to meet with mixed success. As a weapon, it didn't work – mainly because it was so secret that none of the players knew, so we never passed the ball out to the left! Anyway, we lined up:

Jack won the toss and elected to kick with the crossfield wind slightly behind us. Patchway were quick to close down and did the early pressing. In the fifth minute Jack was suckered by a piece of nifty footwork on the right and a dangerous cross to the near post was met with a good header by a Patchway attacker. Greg pulled off a fine reaction save to push the ball round the post. However the ball was played back from the corner and when

the cross came in it was met by a Patchway forward who powered his header past Greg (1-0). Steve cleared a second corner on our right, after 10 minutes, whilst our response was a speculative shot from Jack, on the edge of the area that sailed over the bar.

We were starting to come back in to the game now. Steve looked impressive at the back, and Tom was strong in the tackle and in the air. Mark had taken a few minutes to adjust to the pace of the game – Patchway tend to play the ball quickly with lots of runners in support – but soon started to get in some crunching tackles to break up the play. Dan and Jack were prompting, but the wind was tending to take the ball beyond our front runners and Callum Francombe was seldom under too much pressure as he swept up at the back for Patchway.

Patchway increased their lead in the twentieth minute when a quick throw on the right saw the ball laid off and crossed in low for their forward to lose his marker and crash the ball low past Greg (2-0). In the past, we have folded against Patchway when going a couple of goals down "capitulated" as Rich Pitman said. It was good, therefore, to see some resolve in the team. We battled away in midfield, and although Phil and Zolly were forced deep we tackled well and kept our shape. Our reward came just before the half-hour when we were awarded a free kick for a push in the back of Zolly, on the left. Jack hit the kick in to the box where **Dan** ghosted in to plant a downward header just inside the post (2-1).

Greg pulled off another good save from a header, following a free-kick on our right, and we broke forward to win a corner on the left. Jack swung the ball towards the penalty spot where it dropped for Zolly to drive the ball home, despite the effort of a Patchway defender to clear off the line (2-2). Patchway were not looking so controlled now and

a good cross from Jamie almost found Phil at the back post, a defender just getting his head to the ball first. However, Patchway then broke quickly and it needed a good foot in from Sam, at the expense of a corner to prevent a Patchway forward getting in a shot.

#### HALF TIME: PATCHWAY 2 FRY'S 2

An early scare for us as a cross from the left flank rebounded off the crossbar, before we unluckily went behind in the sixth minute. A cross in from the right reached a Patchway player at the far post and his shot took a deflection, past Greg, and in off the post (3-2). Chances became fewer as both teams defended well, and the midfield battle became fiercer. Nobody was shirking tackles, and there were some real crunchers — hard, but fair. I felt sure that the ball was going to burst at some stage! Patchway did have a free header that was glanced wide following a long throw from the left, but that was about it for almost twenty minutes of the half.

With a quarter of an hour to go Rich came on to replace Zolly, Dan moving up front. Another Patchway long throw saw a back-header just pass our far post before a cross from a short corner evaded Greg's grasp but was hacked to safety. A ball down the left from Rich saw the ever-willing Jamie battle for the ball, only to be foiled again by Callum. With ten minutes to go, Jamie did manage to break free and latch on to a good through ball from Jack, only to shoot weakly straight at the 'keeper.

With five minutes to go Joe came on to replace Phil, but it was Patchway that came closest to getting another goal as Greg finger-tipped a shot from the edge of the area over the bar. Ross came on for the last couple of minutes to replace the flagging Dan as Dave sought to gain a late equaliser, but to no avail. Jon, who hadn't had a lot of the ball, was fouled on the left, in what might have been a dangerous position for a free-kick; but the referee ignored the supplications of players and supporters.

#### FULL TIME: PATCHWAY 3 FRY'S 2

A gritty performance – we didn't stop working, which was good to see. We didn't create many chances and paid for a couple of defensive lapses, but took the game to the wire and had Patchway rocking just before half-time. We did miss Jay's power down the left, and were

With the five old 'uns missing, Craig away at school camp, and Jay injured, this game was always going to be a struggle. Don't forget we'd only beaten Brislington 3-2 in the League with a full squad to choose from. Jack Morgan returned at left back, and James Baker came in at right back. Sam Evans was our only substitute. We also welcomed back Colin Stallard, playing against his old club. The line up was:

Brislington pressed right from the outset, moving the ball about quickly, and running at pace. Nick Guest made an early well-timed clearance to a dangerous cross from the right flank. Then an attempted fancy flick by Curtis gifted the ball to the opposition, but fortunately the shot was struck in to the side netting.

Jack then made a timely interception before confidently running the ball out of defence and releasing Curtis. The ball came back though, and a dangerous cross in from the left saw a Brislington attacker turn Jason and shoot — Nick pulling off a fine save. It was then Tom's turn to come to the rescue with a great sliding tackle.

We were trying to play football when we got the ball, but we seemed to be ploughing through the mud while Brislington appeared to be skating over it. We were unlucky when Curtis, Ian and Ross combined in a good move, but the final pass was just too strong.

With just under a quarter of an hour gone Tom was caught out for pace on the left and attempted what looked like a rugby tackle to bring his opponent down before he reached the penalty area. Sadly, it was inside the area, according to the referee. Fortunately, the penalty kick was blasted against the bar. Tom injured his foot in a tackle and was left hobbling, so when we were awarded a free kick 35 yards out, Curtis tried his luck, but the shot was too high.

Midway through the half and Tom was forced to limp off, Curtis dropping back in to defence. However, before we could re-group Brislington took the lead - a low drive from the edge of the area beat Nick's dive and flashed just inside the post. Two minutes later and it was 2-0 when we were unable to clear a cross in from the right and the ball dropped invitingly for a Brislington forward to crash it in to the roof of the net.

Tom came back on, still limping, to play the role of target man up front. No sooner had he come back on than James went down injured, pulling a muscle in another attempt to prevent Brislington crossing. He was forced to come off and Sam Evans came on to fill the right midfield berth, Liam dropping to right back, and Nick moving up front.

A good through ball from Colin allowed Tom to flick the ball on for Nick, coming through on the burst, but he was sandwiched off the ball. Good control by Curtis and a pass over the Brislington defence allowed Ross a run down the left, but their defence recovered to crowd him out. Colin tried to bustle his way through, but was thwarted and then Sam was quickly closed down as he tried to get a cross in. Colin, Ross, Ian and Tom then combined in a fine passing move that ended with Nick just being caught offside as he ran through on goal.

HALF TIME: FRY'S 0 BRISLINGTON 2 Three minutes in to the half and we were unlucky when Curtis leapt up to cut out a cross only to get just enough of a touch to take it over Nick's head and give a Brislington forward the simplest of headers, two feet from the line (0-3).

We responded with an excellent passing move that saw Ross and Ian play a couple of one-twos before Tom's return to Ross was just reached first by the Brislington 'keeper. Curtis then launched a cross from a free kick in to the area, Tom won the ball in a tackle and got the ball as far as Nick, who couldn't get his cross in. Tom just failed to get his head to a long throw from Jason, but Sam

managed to get a cross back in to the near post only for Brislington to clear. Nick was then forced to come out of his area and intercept with his feet. Jack confidently clearing. Then a deep cross in from the left saw Sam, unsure of who was behind him, calmly volley the ball over his own bar! From the resultant corner the ball was only headed out as far as the edge of the area where a Brislington player drove it back through a crowd of players, past the unsighted Nick and in off the post (0-4).

Nick Guest now dropped in to the back four and Curtis was pushed up front as we went for glory or bust! This left us a bit short in stature and pace at the back - with the exception of Jason - but the two Nicks and Jack combined to clear the ball off the line and thwart another Brislington attack. Twenty minutes gone and for once our marking at the back let us down. An unmarked Brislington player had time to pick his spot but again Nick pulled off an excellent save.

At the other end Curtis had a shot from the edge of the area that took a deflection and looped in to the 'keeper's hands. Then another Brislington corner saw them head narrowly wide. Just under half an hour gone and another long throw from Jason was met by Ross with an overhead kick, the ball cleared the 'keeper and dipped under the bar (1-4). A nice strike! We were now actually looking stronger - the goal had lifted us. A cross in from Tom was sliced just wide of his own goal by a Brislington defender and from Curtis's corner kick Tom headed just wide.
