Early skirmishing saw the first real attacking opportunity arrive in the fourth minute, Jay collected the ball in midfield and released Ross down the left. Ross cut back in and passed back for Jay to get in a cross that the 'keeper managed to hold.

Another ball in from Ross allowed Craig to put Gareth away but although he managed to just get to the ball before a defender he was unable to keep it in play.

Jason comfortably snuffed out an attack from Whitchurch and set Joe up to again release Gareth. Although he got the better of his marker he was unable to deliver a telling ball.

Play in the opening ten minutes was mostly conducted in midfield, but a throw in on the right allowed Nick to get in a cross that Jay met with his right foot, but the shot was deflected for a corner.

Craig sent his cross to the far post where confusion between Joe and Tom allowed the ball to be partially cleared to Ross who swung a boot at it but failed to connect. However, we forced another corner and this time Craig's cross was met by Tom who headed down for Gareth to shoot – again the shot being blocked by a defender.

Phil picked up the ball ten yards in our half and played a good ball through for Ross to turn and cross in for Jay but his attempted return to Ross was too strong and a promising move broke down.

It wasn't until the twelfth minute that Nick actually got to touch the ball – a long through ball comfortably collected at the edge of his area. An attack down our left flank saw Phil concede a throw, but Tom won the ball and cleared. When the ball came back towards our defence he then played a fine crossfield ball for Jay to get to the by-line and win a corner despite being pressed by two defenders.

Another good cross in from Craig, but Tom couldn't quite climb high enough to direct his header on target.

Twenty minutes gone and a good interchange on the left between Phil and Jay almost managed to get Ross away. A foul on Craig gave Tom the chance to launch a free kick in to the area but it was too high for both Gareth and Jay.

Five minutes later and Ross, Gareth and Mark then combined well to give Ross the opportunity of getting in to the box where he was unceremoniously shoved off the ball. Tom sent the 'keeper the wrong way from the spot (1 – 0).

A good through ball from Jason then found Jay on the edge of the area. He laid the ball back for Ross who directed his shot weakly in to the arms of the 'keeper. A crunching tackle on the edge of the Whitchurch area appeared to take the ball first and then the player, but was penalised by the referee with a free kick. The Whitchurch players reacted with obvious disgust at the decision, as did Mr Hunt on the sidelines. However, Tom shot weakly at the 'keeper.

Jason came across quickly foiling a Whitchurch attack and conceding a throw that merely led to Whitchurch being caught offside.

In to the last five minutes of the half and a good ball down the left saw Gareth get round the back of the defence but instead of squaring the ball to the unmarked Ross he elected to shoot – straight at the 'keeper. From the clearance Craig got in a tussle and was penalised, but the free kick was blasted well wide.

HALF TIME: WHITCHURCH 0 COLTS 1

The second half saw us playing against a strengthening wind. Mark and Nick weren't allowed to stay out late and play footy, so went off at half time, Dan and Curtis coming on to replace them.

Curtis' first act was to concede a free kick that Nick caught comfortably and we regained our attacking momentum. A long throw from Jason saw a defender dwell on the ball for too long and be robbed by Curtis who got in a great cross to the back post for Jay to head on but Gareth to be caught offside.

A Whitchurch attack was halted by Tom, at the expense of a throw, that Tom then cleared for Jay to counter attack. He chased and comfortably beat the defender to the ball before laying the ball back to Ross – whose inaccurate pass was intercepted by a Whitchurch player.

Gareth then burst through between two defenders and managed to get a shot in but again it lacked the power to trouble the 'keeper.

Just less than ten minutes of the half gone and Whitchurch managed to win a corner that was played to the edge of the area from where one of their defenders struck a shot wide. The goal kick was hit long down the middle where Curtis latched on to the ball, took it wide of the defence and cracked a great shot home from just inside the area (2-0).

An excellent run down the right saw Gareth impeded by a defender. Tom sent the free kick in to the area where it was cleared only as far as Ross whose shot saw the ball eventually come down with snow on it!

Whitchurch attacked down our right flank and Joe cleared for a throw from which Whitchurch managed a shot that was again off target. We played the ball forward for Jay to shoot wide and we then attacked down the right flank, Curtis freeing Dan who was promptly fouled. The ball was played forward for Curtis to unleash a tremendous shot that the 'keeper just managed to get a hand to, the ball coming out to Ross who was in turn fouled, a couple of yards outside the area. Curtis took the free kick – after the defence eventually retreated ten yards – and unleashed another fine shot that was pushed behind for a corner.

Craig's corner kick was returned to him and a fine cross in saw Gareth, unmarked in the six-yard box, shoot wide.

Almost a quarter of an hour gone and a foul by Gareth on the Whitchurch number six was penalised by the referee. The Whitchurch player persisted with a display of the verbals and was promptly shown the red card. Come in number six, your time's up!

Liam came on to replace Joe and with Whitchurch reduced to ten players we started to exert more pressure and play the ball around. Curtis took the ball to the by-line but his cross was too close to the 'keeper.

Dan got the ball on the left side of the area, turned and let fly with a good shot that rebounded off the underside of the bar and was cleared straight downfield for Danny Hunt to lift the ball over Nick. A pity he was offside.

Tom hit another free kick that was partially cleared only for Dan to find Curtis who jinked his way past a couple of players before unleashing another cracking shot that flew just wide of the top corner.

Play then deteriorated in to a midfield melee for a while, as Whitchurch came to terms with being a player short. Neither side seemed able to get in the opposition area. Curtis, having had two of the best efforts on goal, seemed to think he could successfully take on everybody, but it was Gareth who was brought down inside the penalty area as he tried to break past the Whitchurch defence.

The referee appeared to be booking a Whitchurch player – whether for the foul or something said was not clear – but it was another red card that was shown, so Whitchurch down to nine players with 15 minutes still to play. Again Tom sent the 'keeper the wrong way with the spot kick, only this time the ball was wide of the right hand post.

Pushing by Craig was rewarded with a Whitchurch free kick that was cleared for Curtis to play a good ball to find Ross who shot across the face of the goal.

The last ten minutes saw Whitchurch struggle to keep us out but we were unable to break them down and the game drifted to a close without us managing to add to our score.

Afterthoughts.....

A solid defensive display but a lack of control at times saw us fail to convert our overall supremacy in to goals, so that the final score flattered Whitchurch. It's good to see a referee applying the laws of the game. Too many players think they can get away with swearing and dissent. Not this time!

Dave rested Jay from this game on the basis that Andy's need of a fully fit striker was greater than his. Jon Pitt has been banging them in for us this season, and Zolly was not far behind. Even Dan was in to double figures and we had "Hot Shot" Ross on the bench. Getting the midfield mix right and deciding upon the best defensive line-up for the day was going to be the headache. I suppose that at least Dave's bad back meant that he could take time off work to ponder the options! Anyway, we elected for an early kick off today so that Steve Bacon could get to the final Bristol City game of the season, and so the starting line-up was:

Substitutes: Joe Garland, Phil Knight, Ross Ashman.

We kicked off in to the teeth of the traditional Somerdale spring gale, so it was not too long before we were under pressure from Patchway. An early corner was swung in and a Patchway header flew not too far wide. A push on Jon saw us respond with a free kick that Jack sent low in to the area. Jon managed to get off a snap shot that was destined for the bottom corner of the net but the 'keeper got down quickly to stop.

Poor control from Dan gifted the ball to a Patchway forward, but Steve cleared the danger. Mark was injured in a challenge but recovered. Ten minutes gone and, as the rain started to come down, Jamie robbed a Patchway player in their half and played the ball inside for Jon to hold off a challenge and rifle the ball low past the 'keeper from the edge of the area (1-0).

Two minutes later and another Patchway corner saw Steve rise and fall – a clash of heads. The Patchway player suffered a cut over the eye that sticking plaster repaired. Steve came off.

Another corner was headed clear by Dan as far as the edge of the area where it was seized upon by a Patchway player whose shot was deflected and Greg got down to collect.

Patchway were continuing to pressure and a good tackle from Tom stopped an attack in its track, and then another break through the middle and ball out to our right saw a Patchway player slip the ball past the advancing Greg, but wide of the far post.

Twenty minutes gone and the verdict on Steve was that a trip to Casualty rather than Ashton Gate was on the cards. Off he went with head swathed in bandages and on came Joe. Poor Steve - four staples in the head and missed the City game as well!

Three minutes later and Jamie, a defender and the 'keeper all converged on the ball. Jamie got a touch that took the ball goalwards but it bobbed just wide of the post with Jon just unable to reach it in time to apply the killer touch.

A good cross in from Jamie, on the right, was just too high for Jon who had made a good run to lose his marker. A minute later and a Patchway forward was unmarked in the box but missed his kick with only Greg to beat. Joe reacted quickly to put the ball out for a corner that was well held by Greg at the near post. A shot from a narrow angle then crashed against the post and out for a goalkick.

In to the last minute of normal time and a rash challenge from Rich – from behind against a player going away from goal conceded a free kick five yards outside the area. While we were dithering with the formation of the wall and generally standing around doing nothing, Patchway quickly took the kick, laying the ball off wide of the wall for a shot. Although Mark managed to charge it down the ball ricocheted back for another forward to prod past the wrong-footed Greg (1-1).

Straight from the kick off the ball was played back to Joe who failed to control the ball and was robbed by a Patchway forward who was denied by a good block from Greg, Tom hacking the ball clear.

In to injury time (all Steve's fault!) and another break and Sam came across to clear for a throw. The ball was delivered to the edge of the area where a Patchway shot swerved and dipped over Greg – only a yard off his line – and just under the bar (1-2).

HALF TIME: COLTS 1 PATCHWAY 2

The next goal was going to be the one that could decide the outcome of the game – would it be the start of a fight back by us or give Patchway a two-goal cushion? Patchway were straight back on the attack. Zolly left his man unmarked on the left as the ball was swung over to him from the right. The cross back in saw a good chance wasted with a header just over the bar.

Jack had his legs taken from under him in a challenge ten yards outside the area, dead centre on goal. Jack whipped his shot over the wall, but six inches over the bar as well.

A good interchange down the right involving Mark, Jamie and Jack saw Mark play a good ball between two defenders for Jack to dink a ball in that the 'keeper reached just before Jon. Another ball in to the corner from Mark saw Jamie win a corner taken short and quickly by Jamie but intercepted by a defender. Mark took the throw

and hurled the ball in to the area where Dan managed to get in a hook shot that was over the bar. Patchway broke quickly and Greg had to come out of his area to clear, under pressure.

Greg then pulled off a good point-blank save – even though the forward was offside the referee hadn't blown at the time. A minute later and a good interception by Dan saw him feed Jamie. A poor first touch took the ball wider than he would have wished and he never got his body in to position for the shot that lacked conviction and ballooned wide.

Ten minutes gone and Rich won the ball and passed down the line to Jon. An excellent turn saw the defender miss the ball but not Jon's leg. From the free kick Jack swung the ball in for Dan to head just wide.

Two minutes after Rich Pitman made the comment that Zolly had drifted out of the game he suddenly came to life again. A weaving run took him to the edge of the area from where he hit a low drive that the 'keeper did well to divert round the foot of the post for a corner. Jack's kick was too strong, straight out for a throw on the far side.

A good interception by Zolly and run from Jack looked promising but they were not on the same wavelength when the ball was delivered. Patchway broke forward and Joe intercepted, Mark took over and passed forward for Dan to feed Jon. Again the final ball saw Jon and Jamie misread each other's intentions.

Twenty minutes gone and a foul on the edge of the area saw Jack play the ball to the far post where Rich missed his kick and Mark retrieve the ball and centre low to the near post where the 'keeper held the cross.

Mark then had an effort just off target from 25 yards. Jack was screaming for the ball, but being ten yards behind Mark at the time, it seemed pretty pointless. Too often players are reluctant to take responsibility to shoot. If someone is clearly better placed for a shot then fine - pass the ball – but otherwise if you're in a reasonable position have a go, especially with a strong wind that doesn't make for easy handling for a 'keeper.

Just over a quarter of an hour to go and Joe dithered, allowing a Patchway player to win the ball and take it past him. He then missed his challenge allowing the player to cross low past Greg towards the far post. Tom failed to realise there was a player behind him and was beaten to

the ball, Patchway stabbing it home from close range (1-3). A minute later and a Patchway cross in from the left was seized upon by an attacker whose shot bent round the surprised Greg and just inside the post (1 - 4).

Tom went down injured and Phil was summoned. Tom recovered and Phil was despatched to play on the right side of midfield. Ah. I thought. A winger for a whinger, but no - Jack moved inside with Mark coming off.

Phil won the ball in midfield, exchanged passes with Dan and played the ball through for Jon to shoot narrowly wide of the post. Patchway responded with a shot that Rich cleared off the line, Greg saved the follow-up shot with a point-blank reflex save, Rich cleared off the line again, and Greg managed to dive and claim the ball. Exciting stuff!

A long free kick from Jack saw us claw a goal back as it was deftly directed past the Patchway 'keeper by Jon - no great power in the header but safely on target (2-4).

So, the scene was set for a barnstorming finish, but despite throwing bodies forward and taking risks at the back, a corner on the left that saw Dan unable to get enough height to direct his header on target, was as much as we could muster.

FULL TIME: COLTS 2 PATCHWAY 4

Afterthoughts.....

Defensive lapses didn't aid our cause - losing Steve didn't help. However, as Jack astutely surmised, the midfield players were isolated from our attack. There was no support for Jon and Jamie for most of the time. Now you know Jack why we continually point out that our central midfield players sit too deep. It allows us to hit nice long balls for players to chase, but doesn't give them anyone to pass to if they get the ball!

Thornbury kicked off and did the initial attacking, shooting wide. A good move down our left flank saw Mark, Craig, Liam and Ross combine for Ross to beat his marker, get to the by-line and whip in a hard low cross that Thornbury cleared.

We followed this up with a corner on the left. Craig hit it deep but Tom was unable to get a clean header in and the ball went out for a goalkick. A good through ball from Jay then presented Ian and Ross with an opportunity to chase, but the 'keeper was there first.

Thornbury were quick to get the ball back to our end where Tom surprised everyone with an up-and-under kick rather than heading it back to Nick. Nick headed it out for a corner that was cleared eventually by Ross.

Ten minutes gone and a Thornbury attacker met a good cross in, but he scooped his shot over the bar from eight yards out. Thornbury were playing the better football and doing most of the pressing at this stage, although we were defending stoutly. Our midfield was struggling to get to the ball up first, while defenders were surrounding Jay when we tried to play the ball up to him, and Ian was struggling against the height of their defenders.

Jay and Ian did manage to combine to win a corner and a good cross in from Craig bobbled in the six yard box but the 'keeper was able to claim the ball. The ball was hit straight back down for Jason to head clear before a push in the back by Joe saw Tom head clear the resultant free kick. A Thornbury player tried his luck from 30 yards, but the effort was well wide.

Approaching the last ten minutes of the half and the ball was humped down our left flank, Tom

strolled across to clear but elected to play the ball down the line to Liam, who lost it. With Tom and Liam stranded on the touchline the attacker cut inside and played the ball across to an unmarked player at the back of the area. Joe recovered in time to get a block but the attacker hit the rebound only inches wide.

A foul on Nick, 40 yards out gave Tom the opportunity to pump the ball low towards goal. The 'keeper failed to hold the ball, but we failed to capitalise.

Five minutes to half time and Steve getting agitated on the touchline, screaming about the poor marking, leaving players free.

A corner on our left was headed out by Tom but the ball came back in for Joe to block and Mark to clear. In to the last minute of the half and we strung more than two passes together for almost the first time. Craig, Mark and Ian combined to send Ross away, but although the cross was driven hard and low it was well held by the 'keeper at the near post.

HALF TIME: COLTS 0 FALCONS 0

Andy rallied the troops at half time, told them where they were going wrong – not winning the ball, not passing accurately, midfield not supporting the attack. Don't hit the ball up the middle for the two central defenders to win in the air, attack down the flanks, and get to the by-line and cross - all the usual things that go out of the players' heads as soon as the whistle blows.

Six minutes in to the half and, against the run of play we took the lead with what I think was our first effort on target. A free kick for a foul on Ross and although Tom's kick was too strong for our forwards, but the 'keeper fumbled the ball and **Mark** was following in to bundle it over the line. Despite protestations from the Thornbury players that the 'keeper had both hands on the ball, the goal stood (1-0).

Ten minutes in to the half and Dan came on to replace Nick, Craig moving out wide. A head on by Jay from Craig's throw gave Ian the chance of a shot, but it lacked power.

A good break down the left ended with a poor cross. Tom went down injured following a clash of heads with Falcons' right winger, but recovered after treatment. A long throw from Jason was headed on by Jay and Mark was just beaten to the ball by the 'keeper who went down bravely at

his feet to gather the ball. A good passing move by Thornbury saw an interception by Tom and long clearance that gave Jay a rare opportunity to run at goal, getting between two defenders but then chipping the 'keeper, the shot drifting just wide of the goal.

With a quarter of an hour gone Gareth came on to play up front, Ross coming off and Ian switching to the left. Thornbury continued to press forward and Tom was forced to concede a corner that he then proceeded to head clear. A good ball in to the edge of the area from Ian – well weighted and with precision – saw Gareth and Jay both going for it. The 'keeper came out of his area and calmly dribbled the ball round the pair of them before clearing. Clearly a Barthez disciple.

Twenty minutes gone and Joe came off, Liam switching to right back and Phil coming on. We were actually starting to look a little more threatening now, but Thornbury were still dangerous. Jason came across well to cover, and Liam made a couple of important interceptions as we kept Thornbury at bay.

Then, with just over ten minutes remaining a tackle by Mark was penalised. Forty yards out and the Thornbury player curled the ball over Nick in to the top corner to level the scores (1-1).

Liam ventured forward, only to be fouled and Dan had a free kick from a similar distance to Thornbury's. His shot was over the wall and dipping under the bar, but too close to the 'keeper who parried it and was bundled over by Ian as he caught the ball at the second attempt.

A long through ball then saw Ian and Gareth scrapping for the ball but it just wouldn't drop for them to get a shot in.

Good play by Gareth on the left won us the ball and Jay crossed in for the onrushing Mark who missed the ball completely. Craig recovered it but his cross was behind. Ian then made an interception and released Gareth who collided with a defender and 'keeper as they went for the ball, a corner being won. Craig's cross was hit too long though and went out for a throw on the far side.

In to the last couple of minutes and we gained a throw. Mark wanted to take it quickly, but a Thornbury player was down injured. Unfortunately for Thornbury this worked to our advantage as it gave Jason and Tom time to trot forward. The player recovered after treatment and Jason

hurled another long throw in to the area. Tom rose and the ball just kissed his forehead and floated out of reach of the 'keeper and inside of the post (2-1).

Thornbury attacked with renewed vigour and again our defence held strong. We did get some respite as Dan broke down the left and crossed to the far side of the area where Craig controlled the ball and chipped it inside for Mark to head just wide.

The final whistle couldn't come too soon as far as the spectators were concerned, and Thornbury must have felt that they had been mugged and robbed.
