A wet dull evening but thankfully no wind to worry about. A big game for both teams that could settle the league, so expectations from both sets of supporters were running high to set an exciting scene.

Brislington started well with some quick passing from defence to attack that challenged our defensive skills. In the second minute Jason saved our skin, with a timely interception. Unfortunately, Brislington's direct and quick passing style was causing problems down our left side. In the 5th minute they gained possession in midfield, moving the ball quickly from the right wing, resulting in a well-taken goal.

After the restart the game settled down and we started to get a grip in midfield with Mark and Dan winning good possession. In the 10th minute a good run and shot from Curtis resulted in our first attempt on the Brislington goal.

In the 15th minute Curtis again made a penetrating run down the right to win a corner. Ross took an in-swinger met by Tom's head, which sadly went just over the bar. We were now on top and pushing Brislington back. An exchange of passes between Gareth and Curtis won another corner, which was easily cleared.

Brislington capitalised on some loose play to again hit their front players early but both Jason and Tom defended resolutely. In the 27th minute, a snap shot from the Brislington midfield brought an excellent save from Nick Frost.

We responded well with Mark splitting the Brislington defence with an incisive pass for Curtis to win another corner. Again some solid defending by Brislington thwarted our efforts. A combination of Mark and Dan, who were battling away in midfield slipped the ball to Jay who headed on to Curtis who ran at the Brislington defence only to be judged to have committed a foul - unlucky.

HALF TIME: BRISLINGTON 1 COLTS 0

We battled and defended well without putting the Brislington defence under real pressure. Brislington's movement, particularly up front and quick passing style posed a real threat and danger, so in the second half Andy decided to keep the same line up.

Brislington started the second half with greater urgency, which put our defence under immediate pressure. Jason making a timely tackle and clearance in the first two minutes to save our blushes. Gareth and Dan combined well to win a throw-in and a chance for Mark to show his long throw-in skills, but again the Brislington defence cleared.

A strong tackle from Gareth resulted in the ball falling to Jay who ran directly at the Brislington defence hitting a rasping left foot drive just wide. We continued to take a grip of the game with some inspirational play from our midfield quartet. Winning a free kick in the centre circle, Tom pumped the ball into the Brislington penalty area, which was met by Jay only for the Brislington keeper to gather comfortably.

With 50 minutes gone Brislington turned up the gas after our early domination, a clash in midfield left Mark flat out and clearly distressed. The referee, choosing to let play continue, ignored Mark and allowed the Brislington attacker to continue, who outpaced our defence to slot in their second goal. Disappointing for the team as we dominated the early play in the second half.

From the restart Brislington continued their slick passing game with their midfield and forwards displaying excellent movement. We were still competing well with Dan and Mark winning plenty of possession. In the 55th minute Andy decided to go for broke - introducing Craig for Phil in a tactical substitution to add some attacking flair with a 2-5-3 formation.

Despite being two down our enthusiasm and competitive edge was still evident as we pushed forward. A strong run from Jay on our left flank resulting in a cross which eluded the Brislington defence finding Gareth on the right who set up Curtis to cleverly chip the ball agonisingly too high, hitting the top of the Brislington crossbar.

Another penetrating attack from Brislington brought an excellent save from Nick Frost, and Jason's strength and pace was put under pressure but he responded with determination cancelling out several Brislington attacks. Gareth, Craig and Curtis combined well to get the ball behind the Brislington defence winning a free kick on the right wing. Again the Brislington defence cleared comfortably.

Good movement and sharp passing on the Brislington right stretched our defence after we lost possession to set up Brislington's third goal. A skilful cross eluded Nick, only for Gareth to clear the ball to a Brislington forward who calmly slotted in their third goal on the 60th minute. Straight from the restart a good run and shot by Jay hit the side netting. On 63 minutes Andy substituted Ross for Ian, and we continued to compete with determination to the final whistle.

Afterthoughts.....

Although we lost the game we competed well and matched Brislington for effort throughout the game. On reflection we had greater possession in midfield, particularly in the later stages of the first half and early in the second half without really penetrating the Brislington defence. Brislington had six goal attempts and scored three goals. They moved the ball quickly from defence to attack with slick, accurate passing and intelligent front movement and running. We should not be too disappointed, we are now challenging at the top of our age group, something we did not envisage at the beginning of the season. We can feel proud of our performance, with a touch of disappointment. No doubt we will get our revenge another day!

Avon kicked off, with what wind there was behind them, and for the first few minutes the ball was mostly in the air, with neither team dominating. We were coming to a stop against their defence and they were mostly hitting the ball too long and Nick was fielding the ball.

The first chance came in the seventh minute when Ross was penalised for a foul. The free kick was 40 yards out from goal, but Nick had to get across his line quickly to push the shot round the post. Gareth headed the corner kick out of the danger area for Ross to clear long.

A minute later and Craig's pass back to Joe was under-hit, Joe's clearance was charged down and

bounced back in to the penalty area. Phil got a foot in to take the ball away from an Avon attacker but without sufficient strength to take the ball out for a corner and an Avon forward nipped in at the post to smash the ball home (0-1).

A long throw from Jason allowed Jay to get in a good cross to the far post but Gareth's downward header lacked power and was easily held by the 'keeper. Approaching a quarter of an hour and a high ball from Avon saw Tom and Jason in a tangle that gave an Avon forward the chance to step in and steal the ball. Nick safely gathered the shot at the second attempt. Another foul by Ross – for pushing – and Nick failed to hold on to a deep cross and conceded a corner that saw Avon fail to capitalise upon as they too were penalised for pushing.

Curtis charged down a clearance and reacted quickest to seize upon the loose ball on the right wing. The Avon 'keeper started to advance, then decided to retreat but Curtis's shot cleared the bar as well as the 'keeper.

Jay, Craig and Dan then combined to make ground. A good tackle stopped Dan, but the Avon player then handled the ball while on the ground. Dan struck the 25-yard free kick over the wall but curled it a foot wide of the post. Twenty-five minutes gone and although we were doing most of the pressing we were failing to create chances. A long throw from Jason was headed clear only as far as Curtis on the edge of the box whose attempted lob was just wide.

With five minutes of the half remaining Avon played the ball in from our right flank to the near post where the ball seemed to take Tom by surprise and bounce past him for an Avon forward to poke home (0-2).

HALF TIME: COLTS 0 AVON ATHLETIC 2

Tom climbed all over an Avon player to concede a free kick 35 yards out, but the ball was struck straight at Nick. Craig, Gareth and Curtis combined in a good move down the right that finished with a cross come shot from Curtis that landed on the top of the net. Six minutes in to the half and Mark came on to replace Dan. Mark immediately combined with Ross as they interchanged passes to move from the edge of our area to that of Avon, only for Ross to fail to cut the ball back in and his cross went behind the goal.

Seventeen minutes gone and Andy switched to a back three, Phil coming off and Liam coming on

to bolster the midfield. A storming run from Joe ended with a lay off to Curtis who promptly lost the ball. Two minutes later and Curtis was booked for a reckless challenge on the Avon 'keeper.

A good run by Gareth saw him pass inside to Mark who laid the ball back for Craig to shoot over the bar. Twenty minutes gone and Ian came on to replace Ross. Gareth forced a corner following a head on from Jay, that Joe just failed to get a head to, the ball dropping to be cleared off Jay for a goalkick.

A long throw from Jay saw Mark's effort blocked, and from the ricochet Curtis's miss-hit shot trickled through to the 'keeper. Although we kept on going to the end we failed to create any further chances.
