With Jamie opting to go down the City ground as well as the two regular incumbents, Bacon and Pillinger; Ryan on holiday, Jack with the GFA U18s, Zolly injured and Gareth resting we were only able to field ten players. Steve doubled up as linesman and manager while I was promoted to bucket man and got to slosh water on Jay and Dan, which was fun. The line-up was:

Playing with the strong wind at our backs it took us eight minutes before the first real chance came our way – Dan getting the ball in from the right flank and Jon having a swing with his right foot, the ball passing harmlessly over the bar.

Ross hit a corner on the right too deep and then a corner on the left from Jay was met with a free header from Dan, but the effort was off target.

Twenty minutes gone, and nothing on the scoreboard. The wind was making play difficult, and we had spent most of the time camped in Hengrove's half, but possession and territorial advantage were not to be converted in to goals as we would have liked! A poor goalkick, held up by the wind and misjudged by a defender, allowed Jon to get in a dipping shot from 25 yards that only just cleared the bar. This was as near as we had got.

However, with half an hour gone Jay swung in a corner from the right, the 'keeper got a fist to the ball but knocked it goalwards. A defender tried to head it away from the line rather than over the bar, and the ball dropped nicely for **Ross** to prod home from close range (1-0).

With first half time running out Phil showed good anticipation to intercept a through ball and sent Jay away down the left flank. He skipped a couple of tackles and sent over a fine cross for **Jon** to strike the ball firmly past the 'keeper (2-0).

Well, we know the script don't we? Playing against the wind the ball will hold up and our through balls will be chased and controlled by our attackers rather than running through to the 'keeper or out of play. A slight problem here. Hengrove had a defender to match Jon's pace (and several to match that of Ross!).

Not only that, but after only seven minutes of the half a Hengrove player picked up the ball in space about 35 yards out and let fly. Wallup – pick that out of the back of the net Greg (wringing hand at the same time) – 2-1.

Five minutes later and a push in the back by Jay gave Hengrove a free kick, only a matter of feet inside our half and out almost on the touchline — so no danger. The next minute and the shot was whipped in, the ball bounced in front of Greg, swerved, and needed good reactions to finger-tip it over the bar!

Ross did have a shot blocked and then fired over from a narrow angle as we proceeded to try and play some football and pressure Hengrove, but they defended well.

Twenty minutes gone and a good interception and run down the left by Jay saw him cross and Ross head on for Jon to try and work a way through but he was well marshalled. Mark had a shot blocked and then with a quarter of an hour remaining went closer when he almost seemed to shoulder the ball just past the post.

In to the last ten minutes and Mark played a good ball from the centre of midfield for Jon to latch on to. Just as he broke clear the referee blew up for a late challenge on Mark — just when there was an advantage to be played! Having said that the 'keeper made a complete hash of trying to stop Tom's free kick, ending up with putting it out for a corner.

Five minutes remaining and after touchline moaning about Ross not using his weight enough, what does he do? Challenges for the ball, wins it, slots it home and ..... gets penalised for pushing! Shouts of "No way" from our players but tough luck Rosie, the referee wasn't going to change his mind.

A minute later and a wayward shot from Jon actually found its way as a pass to Dan, on the right touchline. His shot was bundled away for a corner by the 'keeper. Jay hit a super cross that everyone conspired to leave for someone else, as we sought a third goal to make the game safe, but it wasn't to be

We had to walk half a mile from the changing room to the pitch because the school won't allow the club to put a gate in the fence. Not much fun for us let alone injured players trying to hobble back and, incidentally, no access for ambulances — Andy, I want this reported to the League and the Local Education Authority as a Health and Safety issue! Anyway, with Liam unavailable and Ricky rested for this game we lined up:

No real excitement in the first five minutes as players attempted to pass the ball around and try to gauge the effect the wind was having. We were playing with the wind and rain at our backs so expected to be doing most of the pressing.

Five minutes gone and Nick collected the ball as Avon were attacking and launched it downfield. Ian helped it on and Jay flicked it out to Ross. Although a defender managed to cut out Ross's through ball to Dan, the ball dropped nicely for **Jay** to drive the ball home from the edge of the penalty area (1-0).

Nearly a quarter of an hour had gone before the next bit of excitement. A good interchange between lan and Gareth on the right side of midfield ended with a foul on Gareth. Tom launched the free kick from 40 yards towards the goal and the ball shot off the pitch – the 'keeper getting a touch to divert it round the post. Gareth's near-post corner found Jay, but Avon were able to clear. We attempted a few long crossfield balls – both lan and Mark trying to send Ross away – but the ball just ran away for goalkicks each time.

Mark did well to get his head to an Avon clearance and follow it up with a shot from the edge of the area that was struck well enough, but straight at the 'keeper.

Just over 20 minutes gone and Dan won a corner from Jay's long throw. Tom managed to get his head to the ball from Ross's kick, but his effort lacked power and the 'keeper fielded comfortably.

Just under half an hour gone and the rain was sufficiently torrential by now to be forming puddles on the pitch. An Avon defender slipped and allowed Ross to get the ball and play it through for Dan to cross. Jay came in to leather a shot, caught an Avon player's boot instead and went down poleaxed. Dave Frost had the unenviable job of trying to carry Jay back to the dressing room, and Danny came on up front.

A bit of a tiff between Ross and an Avon player saw them squaring up and get a short chat from the referee. Two minutes later and Ross was on the end of a couple of tough challenges, the second of which brought a free kick that Tom curled round the wall from 30 yards only for the 'keeper to push the ball round the post. Ross swung the corner in to the back post where Tom stretched to reach the ball and went down clutching his leg. However, he recovered after treatment to carry on.

In to the last couple of minutes of the half and a foul on Mark saw another free kick cleared by Avon and a good break from them that saw a forward elude Tom and Jason for the first time. From a good position in the centre of the goalmouth he curled the ball round Nick, but also just wide of the post.

Two minutes of the half gone and Mark was penalised for a foul, getting mud in his eye and losing a contact lens as well, just to add injury to insult. Nick held on safely to the resultant free kick that bounced awkwardly at his feet.

Twenty minutes of the half gone and a push in the back of Dan gave Tom the opportunity to pump the ball goalwards but Avon defended resolutely. Ian, Curtis and Danny then combined to give Ben the opportunity of a shot, unfortunately wide of the target.

Phil, Ian, Ben and Danny combined in a good passing move to get the ball in towards Dan who couldn't change direction quickly enough in the slippery conditions. Another good passing move down the right flank saw Ben and Danny combine to set up Curtis for a strong run that finished with a cross in that Dan just failed to reach, and Joe unable to turn the ball back in.

A throw from Curtis saw Dan turn his marker and fire a shot from a narrow angle across the face of the goal, as we moved in to the final ten minutes. A push in the back saw us gain a free kick on the halfway line, and Tom's kick was headed just wide of his own goal by a defender. Ian just failed to make contact with a diving header to Dan's near-post corner and the ball was put out for another corner that was cleared to the edge of the area where Curtis had a wayward shot – the last effort on goal of the match.
