In terms of team success we weren't quite in the Manchester United class – runner's-up in the League Cup at U13 level was our most notable achievement.

However, we've been fortunate in that we've generally had a team of boys that have got on well together and they and many of the parents mix socially. I hope that the friendships made will continue in later life.

We've mainly recruited boys living locally and particularly in the last two seasons have fielded several players eligible to play down a year. We might have been more successful on the field if we had cast our net wider, but would we still have had the camaraderie that exists?

Still, there are other measures of success:

• If the aim is to introduce youngsters to organised, competitive football, then 48 different boys have played for the team at some stage during the past seven years. Those whose names are in bold font were still with the team at the end of the season.

- If it is about improving as a player, then 11 have gained representative honours at U13, U15, or U16 level with the Bristol Junior League while playing for Fry's (R).
- If we want to bring on players for the Club, then 6
 of the current team have already gone on to
 represent Fry Club senior teams this season (S).

As it is we finished runners-up - a highly commendable effort - the most successful Fry Club Junior team in terms of league position, and can look forward to, hopefully going one better next year. Bitton kicked off, with the benefit of the wind behind them, but for the first ten minutes we looked the better side, Danny having three half-chances – first sliding in and just failing to get on the end of a cross, the second thwarted by the 'keeper's legs, and the third a shot that was just wide of the far post. Curtis injured an ankle in a tackle and limped off, and we carried on for a while with ten players.

However, we had an escape on ten minutes when a Bitton forward cut in on the right of our penalty area and drilled a low shot in to the side netting from 10 yards. Twenty minutes in to the half and it was clear that Curtis couldn't come back on and so Ben came on to play wide right, Ricky switching to the left. Five minutes later and some good footwork from Dan saw his pass find Mark bursting in to the area, only for his shot to be well-saved by the Bitton 'keeper. Ian was then unlucky as he managed to win a clearance and get in a shot that the 'keeper held under the bar.

With half an hour gone, Bitton took the lead. A hopeful wind-assisted punt saw Nick come to collect, have second thoughts, and be beaten by the bounce (0-1). The nearest we came to a first half equaliser was when Ricky saw an in-swinging corner to the near post headed off the line by a defender.

Five minutes in to the half and a through ball played in behind Tom saw a Bitton player through and beat Nick only for Tom to get back and clear his goal-bound effort, and then a dipping effort from Bitton only just cleared the bar. Another Bitton attack was foiled and Phil cleared long for Dan to chase on to and fire in a low shot from the edge of the area that the 'keeper stuck out a foot and managed to save.

With 20 minutes gone a foul on Ricky saw Tom launch the ball in to the area where Dan got in a shot that the 'keeper blocked. The ball came to lan whose shot evaded the 'keeper, hit the post and went a long the goal line, past the other post and out for a goal kick. If the post had been round rather than square then it would probably have gone in the net.

With almost half an hour gone Bitton almost went two up as a shot in saw Nick stranded, but Phil managed to clear for a corner. A minute later though and it was us that scored. A free kick saw Dan and 'keeper go for the ball, and it drop free for Ricky to get the ball back for **Dan** to turn and hack home from close range (1-1).

Looking to win the match, Joe had been pushed forward in to midfield and we were exposed at the back five minutes later as a raid down our right flank pulled Tom and Jason across, leaving Phil on his own. The ball broke kindly from his tackle for a Bitton player to calmly beat Nick (1-2).

In to the last minute of normal time and **Tom** snatched another equalizer from Ricky's corner (2-2) to set up what we hoped would be a storming finish. Unfortunately, the finish was marred by a nasty injury to Dan, who dislocated his right knee – the referee calling the match off with two minutes of injury time remaining, as we waited for the ambulance to arrive.
