Can I please reiterate what I have asked in the past, NO SHOUTING INSTRUCTIONS AT THE PLAYERS. I'm sorry to have to put it that way but I feel that the players are just getting confused, especially as I saw seven different people giving instructions last Sunday. As I have said in the past, the only people who are to be giving instructions to the players, about where to stand and what to do, are Jack Gooding and I for the Home/Green team \& Tom Baker and I for the Away/Yellow team. Many eminent sports psychologists, analysts \& coaches will tell you the same thing: You cannot teach players to play football during a game. That must come at training. All that will happen is you will confuse them. If in the future your son is lucky enough to be picked up by a professional club then you will be told to be quiet. If you cannot then you and your son will be told to leave. Now I am not going to ask anyone to leave but please can you keep your comments to that of encouragement only. If Jack or Tom or I am away then it may be necessary for someone to take up the controlling voice, but I will delegate that responsibility, and I would ask you all to still respect my view. Now I know that I am not the most vocal person during the games, but it has worked for me before and I do not see any reason to change my approach. Finally, if you feel that something really needs to be said then tell me and to avoid confusion, I can do it. - Thanks, Andy
