Not much happened in the first few minutes except we remembered just how fast their two forwards were! We attacked down the right and Jay swung the ball in. Andy charged at the 'keeper, but he held it well. They then attacked with a ball over the top, which Aaron just got his toe to, but they were quick, and we could see what strategy they would utilise. Tom won the ball with a battling tackle and laid it in to Andy with his back to goal. He played it off for Joe to hit as hard as he could, but it was always going wide. Joe then launched a throw for Tom to turn and shoot from, but it went high over the far post. Sam & Max combined well to get it to Joe. He tried to return it with a back flick, lost it, and a quick ball forward saw their attacker through on goal. Joby came out to narrow the angle and got the faintest part of his glove to the ball to deflect the ball wide. Aaron came to the left and won it, but his pass forward was cut out and they hit it to the far side where Dan was against their quickest player. Dan just got his boot to it to flick it up and backwards, and Joby rushed out and dived on it with attackers bearing down on him. We then hit a ball over the top for Sam to chase and he hit it inside for Andy to run after, but this time their 'keeper rushed out and just got his hand to it in time.
