I laid out all of the options to the players, reminding them of the high of winning 5-1 against St Nicks 'B' with ten players, but also of the low of losing 7-1 against Brislington with ten, and I left the choice to them. After a short discussion amongst themselves they came back and said that they wanted to give it a go.

After a bit of passing back and forth between both teams, Sam won it and hit it forward to where Jake flicked it past a defender and Callum was through in on the 'keeper but he blasted his shot too high. We took a quick throw down the left for Tom who played it down the line for Callum to keep it in. He beat the defender and had a shot, this time lower, but still just over. They were looking to overload us and went for goal. Aaron's challenge slowed them , then Brandon's did the same but two still got through, however Reece's sliding tackle took the ball. We were attacking, however the ball was lost and they broke down the left quickly and played a ball across the edge of the box to their player who controlled and shot first time past Charlie's dive 1-0. Tom then went in for a challenge and was caught by studs raking down the side of his ankle, the upshot of which was he couldn't play on and we were down to nine players. At this point there was a lot of discussion between various people, some of it a bit heated about the laws and what to do. The ref said that the game would be abandoned if we went down to seven and I felt that this was wrong and that it was nine. Later on a few

others said that they had checked various sources and it was eight. I pointed out Reece hobbling to the referee and he went to speak to him, where Reece basically said that he wouldn't last past half-time. The Ref, not knowing for sure still said seven, but I basically said that the next injury would be seven so why play on.
