After not touring last year due to numbers, we were back this year to a new location and new oppositions. It turned out that both of them were coming again, and we were going to be the same week as the Juniors, so it would be great socially to have so many there at one time. We had a total of eight players from our team, as well as Sam Black from Keynsham, Sam Kipling's brother Gary, and Jake Garnett, Dan Kendall, Aaron Loughlin, Ben Harper (Harpz) and Ben (Clappy) Clapp from our old U14 squad. If need be, Bryn's brother Gareth was available, as was Mitch, but as we were playing U14's, I felt he would be too small. We were staying at Dawlish Warren, and so just five minutes away was Dawlish Utd. Because of this, Bryn's younger brother Gareth had agreed to be sub. The game was played on a pitch in, for want of a better word, a cage!
