Fry Club Colts Under 14

Declan Gaydon - Dec joined the team this year and has been a major influence on the team's progression. Having had spells at both City Supporters and Rovers Supporters in the 1st Division, Dec is used to the big occasion and will not be fazed by it. A big hit with the rest of the team, Dec is looking forward to facing his old team.

Josh Jewell - Josh joined Frys halfway through last season having not played for a few years, but had previously been at Whitchurch when they were a top three 1st Division side. Converted from midfield to right-back over the Summer, Josh has made the position his own with repeated excellent performances and is a big favourite amongst the team.

Reece Provis - Reece joined Frys at the start of the U13 season having previously played for Bristol Utd. He played every game of that season despite a constant niggling injury, and now Reece has put all of his injury worries behind him this season and has flourished as one of the rocks at the heart of the Frys defence and a fan's favourite.

Aaron Sutton - Aaron was one of the original eight players who turned up as an U6 in 2002 and was Player's Player of the Year as an U7. Family circumstances saw Aaron join AEK Boco the following year, but he returned as an U11 and has established himself as one of the most feared players in the League, as well as winning Player's Player twice more, and Club Player of the Year as an U12. Aaron is also the team Vice-Captain.

Joel Harvey - Joel came to Frys near the end of the U9 season having been playing in goal a year up at Brislington. Not wanting to stay in goal, Joel's ferocious tackles saw him anchor the team's U10 League win and since then many a right wing player has paled at the sight of him. Joel was the U11 Parent's Sportsman of the Year as well as Most Improved Player.

Bryn Williams - Bryn was another player to join Frys at the start of the U13 season having previously plied his trade at Saltford Stars. Bryn's nimble footwork and speed has bamboozled many an opposition player and he grew in strength as well as he became accustomed to the pace of the division, deservedly winning last season's Most Improved Player.

Sam Kipling - Sam joined Frys just a few weeks into the U6 season and has been here ever since. Player of the Year that first season and again as an U10 as well as a Player's Player of the Year, Sam has consistently been amongst the best players in the team. A broken ankle saw him miss much of the U13 season, but he has returned this year back to his very best. Sam is also the team Captain.

Max Stevens - Max joined the team on the same day as Sam and his quick feet and close control has seen Max consistently in the team ever since. Three times Parent's Sportsman as well as one Player's Player of the Year, Max is a huge favourite with both the team and the supporters, and will give 100% every game. Although initially concerned that the 1st Division would be a step too far for him, he has long forgotten those fears and proved he can play at the highest level.

Lorenzo Mercato - Lore joined the team at the start of this season having previously played for Mangotsfield and has quickly established himself in the 1st Division, with "quick" being the operative word, as he has torn away from defences all season. With many games still to go, Lore is already closing in on 50 goals in all competitions and has formed a fearsome partnership with Callum.

Tom Johnson - Tom is the only other surviving member of the original U6 eight, and is the team's longest serving player. Tom has twice been the team's highest goal-scorer as well as twice Player's Player of the Year and the U8 Club Player of the Year. Although a niggling heel injury has hampered his last two seasons, Tom has still been a major influence on the team with his move to a more holding role in the middle of the midfield.

Callum Fry - Callum joined Frys at the start of the U13 season from Keynsham, and was an instant hit, scoring almost 30 goals in all competitions and winning the Club Player of the Year. This season he has almost doubled that tally with many games still to go and along with Lore is part of one of the Division's most feared attacks with over 100 goals between them in all competitions.

Noah McCarthy - Noah joined the team at the start of this season having not previously played for anyone else. He has quickly established himself amongst the team, and his pace and power has unsettled many opposition players, as well as his ability to adapt to any role on the field, which during the semi-final included six different positions.

Charlie Hayne - Charlie joined Frys at the start of the U13 season from Bristol Utd and has shown that he can adapt to any situation. At his best in midfield, Charlie's ability to find space as well as use both feet equally as well has seen him fill many roles for the team. Team History

Fry Colts U14's - Formed as Under 6's in 2002, the team found their level as Under 10's when they became only the third team from the Club to win a Hanham Minor League title, winning the 3rd Division. Two years later as U12's in the Avon Youth League they gained promotion to Division 1 as League Runners-Up. Finished 10th in their first season, and have pushed onwards this year, never out of the top half of the table. Their high point was winning the semi-final after extra-time against arguably one of the best teams in the South West, and know that they have to produce a similar effort if they are to go that one final step.
