Sam picked up the loose ball and found Max left and he went down the line to Callum, who worked hard down the line to get past his defender and hit to the middle where Lorenzo and their 'keeper came together, forcing the ball out, but too fast for Bryn who it hit, and rebounded out for a goal-kick. Max won it back from their throw and he played it to Lorenzo, who was on their last man. He played it right to Callum, who took a touch and rifled it into the bottom left, although in fairness the 'keeper did get a hand to it 0-1. The ref' kept penalising Bryn for fouls, obviously the new Frys hard man!!! They won a throw right by the far right corner, and it bypassed four of our players, and their player hit it as he spun, from the narrowest of angles and it somehow found the corner 1-1.
