We started the game strongly, closing the Bitton players down and forcing them to concede a corner out on the left almost straight away. Callum floated it over and Tom jumped, back heading it goal-wards after less than a minute 1-0, Another great ball from Sam saw Lorenzo through, but Mo in goal for them was out quickly to block. Then Callum played Lorenzo in at a narrow angle but again Mo stood tall and blocked. We were running rampant and two more chances were saved by Mo, one a point blank shot pushed over the bar. We couldn't keep this level of pressure up however and Bitton finally came into the game, mainly due to their new signing from Cadbury Heath 'B', the big defender being employed as a central midfielder here. For some reason none of our players seemed to want to go near him and guite a few times players backed out of challenges with him (although we could always rely on Joel not to care as he flew in three times to win the ball). Although the ground was muddy and sticky, Bitton moved it very well and we started to panic in both defence and midfield, leading the sliced clearances putting us under more pressure rather than calmly looking for the pass. Dec was called into action a few times as Bitton started to create chances and twice made two great parries, once that josh cleared and the other by Reece. Bitton piled more forward and another melee saw Dec save and it fell invitingly on the edge of the box for a shot which was driven in with some venom, however Max flung himself in harm's way and the ball glanced up off of his back, hit the underside of the crossbar, bounced down on the line, and Josh got it clear. Without that deflection they would have had their equaliser. It was not long in coming however as Bitton kept up the pressure and a ball into our box was saved by a diving Dec, but the clearance were sliced

upwards and not fully made, and eventually it dropped invitingly for Joe Hillard and he smashed it home from two yards **1-1**.
