After a bit of loose possession they launched a few crosses which we cleared, and then they broke through and Dec was out quick at their feet to clear, but then their big midfielder picked up the ball in the centre of the pitch, ran at us holding off our challenges before firing off a 30 yard low speculative shot, which must have taken a dodgy bounce as it deceived Dec and flew past him 1-0. We finally started to challenge for the ball, Sam finding Lorenzo, who knocked it off to Tom, and he played the return for Lorenzo and he calmly passed it past the out-rushing 'keeper 1-1. Bryn and Josh won it halfway and produced some nice interplay before finding Lorenzo, and it all seemed to open up, 'keeper falling the wrong way, defender going the other and he had a 10 yard open goal. It poked at it, and somehow he managed to hit it the wrong side of the post, which it hit and went for a goal-kick. pressure but they were dangerous on the break, especially their quick right wing, and he crossed the ball, which we challenged for against their big player, but it bounced down for another attacker on the edge of the area and he fired it high into the net 2-1.
