***Afterthoughts**.....  
Chippenham has gotten smaller over time, and with only ten entries this was the smallest. Also the standard of opposition has dropped, and in all honestly only Laverstock, Robins or ourselves were of any real quality. The referees were also dubious, and so with heavy heart (as I've always liked it here) I feel it's time to turn away from Chippenham. There was a great moment after the group stages when I mentioned that we hadn't conceded, and George looked really surprised. I asked about this and he said "It's not something I'm used to!" Priceless. As for our performance, all seven outfield players went sub equally and yet we easily made the semi-final, showing the quality that we have, but in Laverstock, we faced an opposition at the top of their game.*

*At Bitton I have to admit to feeling a bit disappointed when I saw that it was ten minute games at 11-a-side. Although it's 11 players on a big pitch, with only ten minutes you need to go for it quickly and play with a 6-a-side mentality, and that I feel was our eventual undoing. We looked a bit lethargic in our last group game, and even more so in the semi-final, but we still created many chances and really should have beaten them. After beating Bitton in the group stages, it would have been nice to have faced them in the final, however I am not a fan of one group going to play-offs. The final consisted of third v fourth having all played each other. In my view this should be one group, medals for the top two! I don't like the way they decide the Rugby Union Premiership for the same reason, and that, along with the fact that they allow current Academy players to play is why we won't come back here, unless the format changes.*

*Our tournament is always tough, and with a record 29 teams entering, whoever won had to play eleven games for the honour. We had Sam and Elliot away, and lost Lorenzo on the Friday night to torn ligaments, but that is not making excuses. Both teams played well and tried their best, but as Manchester United found out the night before, there is always someone better than you, and on the day it was the League, Cup & County Cup winners!*

*I actually have a tinge of sadness about winning at Corsham thanks to my "don't go back if we win" policy, as I really do enjoy it there. That said, the boys have done something that I have waited over 15 years for, and I am very proud of the team that*

*played. They never looked flustered or really under pressure, and they played some scintillating football, and in my view were worthy winners.*

*Bath Arsenal was always going to be tough, with both Bitton and Jamie Shore in our group of seven, and only two going through. We played some great football in some games, and some awful in others, and it was no surprise when we were eliminated. It's a very good tournament however, with strong opposition and a good number of games. The only drawback for me is that they allow each team one Academy player, so you are not facing the real team, and I wonder why teams bring them in, as it can only be to win!*

*Weston was a very long day, about ten hours for each of us. I don't like the long break format, but I do like the 20 minute final with another 10 for extra-time. I felt that overall we were the strongest team with Weston Crusaders, and that would have been a great final. In the end I felt that the Banwell players let themselves down. We have been on the end of some bad decisions, but have never acted that way, and whilst I know they felt aggrieved, the rules were correctly applied.*

*I didn't see this game, but by the accounts of the players, it was a tournament that we could have won, and yet ended up Shield runners-Up for the second year in a row. It was nice to finally see Ben Watt play for us, and let's hope it's the beginning of many!*

*Highworth was a really good tournament, well run and well organised. We played good football, and were at our very best*

against the "Academy" team, but couldn't keep that level of intensity into the semi. We also ended with Sam injured, and both Harry and Aaron feeling unwell (burgers?). Overall a good tournament and one I would consider for next season.

Rovers was our last 6-a-side of the Summer (Whitchurch being 11-a-side), and what a great way to end that part. Like Corsham I have been coming here on and off for years, so to finally win it was a great achievement. We played excellent football, and even with a smattering on academy players, I believe that we were easily the best team on the day, and deserved winners.

Whitchurch saw us end the summer on a real high. We rarely come here due to its middle of the summer date, but we went for it this time and I'm glad we did, not just because we won, but also because it was a well run tournament with a decent number of games. The 10-minute format which Bitton also use has grown on me, and if we hadn't have won I would have considered returning.

Another great Summer! Last Summer we had three Winners, three Runners-Up and three Semi-Finals, so whilst not quite as successful, with four Winners, one Runners-Up and three Semi-Finals, this one comes close, and with four winners is our highest win tally. Again Frys was the only one where it really rained (although there were times at Weston when we were glad of the gazebo), and most were great sunshine. My biggest highlight was winning at Corsham. Having run two teams now, I have been going there for about 15 years, so to finally win it was fantastic, although
