They took a quick throw into the corner and Reece charged over with a great tackle. The ball spun loose however and Harry was quick out to smother the danger. Stoke Lane forced a corner which was cleared back out, so they lobbed it high towards the back post to where two players charged in on Harry, also with the sun in his eyes, and one of them got the telling touch 1-0. We won a free kick which Aaron took, floating a lovely ball in to their area, which was cleared as far as Joel running in, but his low shot was also blocked, but we managed to get it to Lore, and his turn and shot was well saved by the diving 'keeper. Stoke Lane then attacked again, and had a thunderous shot from distance which Harry did well to grab hold of. They had a free kick which they hit into our area which Sam stooped low to head clear, Max flicked it away from the attacker and Bryn hit it forward for Lore, however the 'keeper just got there ahead of him. They took a long corner which went to the back post and was returned for a ferocious close range shot, which saw incredible reflexes from Harry to push up, and as it came down Josh cleared the danger. We pointed this out to the referee, however his view was that he saw the flag after the offense had been committed and therefore in his view the penalty stood. They stepped forward and smashed it in 2-2. A high ball through was struck on the volley, and Harry dived brilliantly to save.

Page 24 of Laws of the Game 20112012 state:

The decisions of the referee regarding facts connected with play, including whether or not a goal is scored and the result of the match, are final. The referee may only change a decision on realising that it is incorrect or, at his discretion, on the advice of an assistant referee or the fourth official, provided that he has not restarted play or terminated the match.

The game had not been restarted so he should have come back for the foul throw. After the match, the referee felt obliged to explain his decision again at which point I asked what he would have done if he had been at one end, we had broken quickly, scored, he had blown for a goal, and then he had seen an offside flag, what would he have done? He admitted in that instance he would have disallowed the goal. The same should have applied to the foul throw, and that cost us the win, and two extra points.
