We started the game well, passing it around on the very uneven surface, and not letting Warmley get a touch. After a while they started to get on the ball, and then a long punt across the field into the left of the area, and an attacker stormed in and hammered it into the bottom right **1-0**. A quick succession of passes saw Del played down the line, and in towards goal, but he was tackled as he went to shoot. Another long ball over our defence saw a mix up, as Harry called "Harry's ball", but then it hit an awkward bobble and bounced away. Jay managed to get in the way, but the attacker was able to swivel and shoot, but Sam had run back to cover, and cleared the ball off of the line. Tom won the ball and played to Lewis, and he found Jay. Jay

played it forward for Del who attacked in, but was tackled in the area. Warmley had a free-kick wide on the left, which was floated over high, and everyone running in missed it, however it hit the far post and bounced back and in **2-0**.

Finally Warmley started to pass the ball about, and good play down their right saw a cross, which was hammered high and goal-wards from five yards, but hit the underside of the crossbar, bounced down, and Sam was there to clear.
