It was nice to see an old friend in the opposition ranks with Kruz playing in defence for them. We started on the front foot with Charlie threading a pass through the eye of the needle to Cory who flicked the ball on to Ethem whose shot went wide. Keynsham got the ball to the half way line before Finn made a good tackle and passed to Bartek who crossed the ball into the penalty area where Cory managed to get to the ball, control it, and smack it past the 'keeper 0-1. Charlie soon made a great tackle out wide on the left-hand side and battled well to make a yard of space then passed the ball into the middle to the edge of the Keynsham penalty area where **Cory** ran onto the ball, went around one defender before stroking the ball into the back of the net 0-2. We were passing the ball really well and some of the passes by Charlie were a different class, his first thought to see where he can move the ball to. Keynsham were not having much joy in getting into our half but they did one long ball that their striker looked for all the world he would get to and score, but Alfie came off of his line really quickly and smothered the ball to snuff out the chance for them. Brad W got the ball from Alfie and when faced with a Keynsham player used some of his silky skills to beat the player; he then passed back to Brad G (who keeps putting two boys with same name in the same team?) who looked up and saw Charlie in space on the edge of area and found him with

Keynsham then cleared the danger but it was not long before we were attacking again and a pass from Cory saw Bartek in space; he worked a good angle for himself before finishing the move with a good shot **0-6**. Charlie was still passing the ball really well and a great cross-field pass found Finn who slid past his marker and was in space; he battled well to the edge of the area and passed out wide to Ethem who used his strength well to bulldozer his way into the penalty area and got a good shot away which was well saved by the 'keeper. To be fair to Keynsham they tried to play football in the right way and all the time looked to pass the ball out from the back, however we were quick to pounce on any errors and Brad W intercepted a pass, found Charlie who again played a great pass to Brad G who with one touch left two Keynsham players in his wake before slotting the ball into the net **0-7**. Keynsham kept going and they did manage to work the ball well to the edge of our area and got a shot away which Alfie did well to save. The 2nd game started in the same of fashion as the 1st one finished with our players on the front foot. Tyler played the ball through to **James** who was in the middle of their half, he took touch to his right and opened his body to get the correct angle to power in a rocket of a shot that went like an arrow into the bottom left hand corner of the net **0-1**. We were playing some really good football and the passing was the best that this side has played! A lovely move involving Kaylum and Liam ended up with James pinging a cross to where Jamie, as cool as a cucumber, delicately finishing by deflecting the ball into the net 0-2. We were soon on the attack again with Tyler finding Liam out on the left. He passed into the middle where Kaylum tried a Messi style chip that went narrowly wide; had it had gone it would have been the goal of the season. That did not put us off our step though and a quick passing move meant that James jinked his way to the wide right before cutting the ball back to **Kaylum** in space in the box who took a touch and passed the ball past the 'keeper into the back of the net **0-3**. A good move down the left gave Ronnie the chance to cross the ball into box, a Keynsham player got there to knock it behind for a corner.
