We were first on the attack and forceful run from James saw him get into the Boco half. He passed out wide to Aran who did well to get to the edge of the area before getting in a cracking cross which Bartek managed to get to first. He was under a lot of pressure though and could only guide his shot wide of the post. Boco broke on us very quickly and suddenly Cory had two players to deal with on his own; he did very well to guide them out wide so that when they did shoot it was from a very narrow angle and the ball went well wide. Alfie cleared to Bradley W who powered forward then cut inside before finding James with a fantastic pass! James then made a quick exchange of passes with Aran, the return pass from Aran slightly ahead of James, and so James had to stretch when shooting and the 'keeper saved well. It was end to end stuff and Boco were

attacking, and we kept backing off, not getting any tackles and eventually they shot from the edge of the area. Alfie did well to make the save, the ball came back out and they reacted quickest firing in a shot that thundered in off the underside of the bar **0-1**. They pressured us well and only a good tackle from Finn prevented another shot at our goal. They got the ball out on their right and passed the ball well to get to the area to their big lad who was causing us trouble more with his size and power than skill but like I said he was powerful and hit a rocket of a shot which flew into the net before Alfie could move **0-2**. We were trying to play some good football and a lovely touch from Bartek saw Aran with space to run into which he did with areat austo; he got to the byline and cut the ball back to Bartek whose shot was well saved. After the wobble where we conceded two goals in a couple of minutes, we were now very composed at the back with Tristen showing great maturity with both his tackling and some excellent distribution: both Cory and Finn making important tackles as well, getting a foot in at the right time on more than one occasion. Before the half time whistle blew, Bradley W went on run down the left side, beating two players with great skill before whipping in a great cross that Bartek did well to deflect goal wards, the 'keeper doing well to make the crucial save.

We were on the front foot from the start of the 2nd half and Bradley was playing very well and a neat bit of skill gave him a yard of space to run into; he got to the edge of the area and hit a low shot towards the far post which the 'keeper did very well to get down and make a very good save. They went for the long ball but Tristen had read the situation well and got to the ball first and calmly found James in the middle of our half and a lovely ball from James from our half to just inside their half found **Aran** who controlled the ball beautifully before pushing the ball past the defender and using his speed to get to the ball first; he was still outside the area but drilled a shot which came off of the post and into the back of the net, a truly magnificent shot 1-2. They were soon on the attack and were passing the ball well in our half. We seemed reluctant to tackle them and they found their way into the penalty box before shooting and only a good save from Alfie prevented them from scoring as he knocked it behind for a corner. They took a short corner which we had not switched on to and then when the cross came in they reacted first and poked the ball behind Alfie into the net 0-1. A good pass from Kaylum gave Liam the chance to attack the Boco goal; he shot from distance, and it went wide of the post. Boco were playing some quick pass and move football that we were unable to stop and from the edge of the area they hit a low skidding shot which bounced just in front of Alfie and into the net **0-2**. A good bit of play from Charlie saw him get the ball off of a Boco player and take it on a couple of yards before a delightful pass found Bradley just inside the Boco half; a

good touch from Bradley laid the ball off to Liam who ran at the Boco goal, and he looked up and hit a shot which just went over the bar. Boco put us under immense pressure and only some good tackles and last-ditch blocks from Keanu and Bradley prevented any further goals. A quick move though from Boco got to the edge of the area; Finn did well to stop the first attack but had no help and was overwhelmed by two Boco players who managed to get by the penalty area before scoring **0-3**.
