They started well, coming straight through our centre, but the defence kept a good line and caught them offside a couple of times. Some good football from Finley in the middle saw him win the ball and get the ball to James who played a delightful ball to Tyler and he in turn got to the edge of the area before shooting; the 'keeper was beaten but the shot just went wide. A good tackle saw Cory win the ball then play a great ball to Kaylum, who used his strength to go through on goal, but as he shot his boot came off which went further than ball! They cleared but Tristan intercepted it and his thunderbolt of a shot was well saved by the 'keeper. We lost the ball in midfield, and they came straight at us and shot low and hard into the bottom corner 0-1. We were playing good football and passing the ball well and a nice pass from Tyler found Bradley G who hit his shot just wide. They broke down their right, Cory got a great block in, the ball though deflected into the middle where they got a great strike in from the edge of the area to score 0-2.
